Albia Schools to host community meeting May 22 about facilities

District seeks public input as it takes next steps in facility master planning process

ALBIA, IA — The Albia Community School District invites all residents to attend a community meeting on Wednesday, May 22, to provide feedback as part of the district's development of a blueprint for the future of its facilities. The event will begin at 6 p.m. in the Junior High and High School Library.

This community meeting marks an important phase in the master planning process initiated by ACSD in February. Over the past few months, the planning process has involved a comprehensive evaluation of the district's existing facilities and an exploration of future developmental pathways.

In March, the educational leadership team—comprising representatives from various departments—outlined the immediate, future, and long-term needs of their respective areas.

A community task force was also convened to review the information gathered through the planning process and brainstorm multiple approaches for our facility blueprints. The results of these brainstorming sessions were turned into actionable plans in partnership with Boyd Jones and INVISION.
