

# **MOWING NOTICE**

The City of Diagonal has an ordinance addressing mowing and property maintenance. Under Chapter 147 of the City Code, any property vacated or non-vacated is required to be mowed any time the vegetation reaches a height of more than 12 inches by the 15th day of the month in May, June, July, August, September, and October of each year. Any property not mowed by the above dates may be mowed by the City or their agents, and a charge of \$75.00 per hour plus a surcharge of \$100.00 will be charged to the property owner. Any property owner who fail to mow their properties, thus allowing them to be mowed by the City, who do not provide payment for the mowing as required, will be assessed by the City for such costs, which will be collected in the same manner as general property taxes.
