p.m. The City Administrator, Jeremiah Hoyt, and the City Engineer, Melissa Clow with HR Green, gave an update on the possible options for Dillon Military Bridge including restoration in place, relocation with TAP regional funding, relocation with other

Sixteen citizens voiced their opinion on the future of the Dillon Military Bridge. The County Attorney and County Engineer also spoke on the topic. The public comment portion of the meeting ending at 7:22 p.m. The City Council and Board discussed the future of the bridge, costs of restoration, potential funding and the next steps. HR Green needs to know which option the City wants to move forward with

the City wants to move forward with in order to find funding sources. The County urged the City to follow the 28E Agreement language that states the City must make a proposal and submit it to the County in writing. The City Council voted to move forward with the restoration in place option and will submit the written proposal to the Board of Supervisors within
