**Public Notice**  
**ORDINANCE 1163**  
An Ordinance Amending Section 105.4.11 – Parking Fines of Chapter 105 of the Waverly Municipal Code of Ordinances.  
BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAVERLY, IOWA :  
Section 1. That Section 105.4.11 – Parking Fines of Chapter 105 of the Waverly Municipal Code of Ordinances is hereby amended and therefore read as follows :  
SEC. 105.4.11 ILLEGAL PARKING FINES  
A.A fine of \$20.00 shall be issued by the Waverly Police Department for illegal parking within the City of Waverly, Iowa. This fine shall apply to all illegal parking activities within the City of Waverly, Iowa, except for improper use of a persons with disabilities parking space or permit and those illegal parking activities for which a conflicting fine is specifically provided for by the Code of Iowa. A fine for improper use of a persons with disabilities parking space; or improper use of a persons with disabilities parking permit shall be \$100.00.  
These fines may be charged and collected upon a simple notice of fine in the form of a parking ticket payable to the Waverly Police Department Clerk at the Bremer-Waverly Law Enforcement Center.  
The \$20 fine shall increase to \$25.00 if the parking violation is not paid within 30 days of the date upon which the violation occurred.  
All fines collected by the City pursuant to the above paragraphs shall be retained by the City.  
B.The fine established herein shall be effective June 1, 2025.  
C.In any proceedings for violation of the parking provisions of this ordinance, the registered owner or title owner involved in said violations shall constitute in evidence a prima facie presumption that the owner of such vehicle, as defined by State of IA 321.1.90, was the person who parked or placed such vehicle at the point where such violation occurred.  
D.A parking ticket issued under paragraph A of this section shall contain the following statement: "Failure to pay parking fines owed by you can be grounds for refusing to renew your motor vehicle's registration."  
E.Notwithstanding this Ordinance, violation of this Section may be prosecuted under the provisions of Iowa Code Sections 805.7 to 805.13 or as any other traffic violation.  
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WAVERLY, IOWA:  
Section 2. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.  
Section 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.  
Section 4. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
