LARKSVILLE The Clarksville City Council met in regular session July 7 to discuss a range of issues, including chickens in city limits, water rates, food trucks, and zoning changes. Mayor Jerald Heuer presided, with council members Roger Doty, Taran Sherburne and Ruth Saulsbury present. Jessi Reints and Jennifer Kielman were absent.





The council reviewed concerns about backyard chickens, including the presence of roosters, and discussed the possibility of implementing a permitting process. Saulsbury agreed to research ordinances from nearby towns.

Board of Supervisors Approves Early Childhood **Contracts**, **Utility Permit**

ALLISON — The Butler County Board of Supervisors met June 24 for its regular session, with Chair Rusty Eddy and Supervisor Wayne Dralle present. Supervisor Greg Barnett was absent.

During the meeting, the board approved several items related to Early Childhood Iowa (ECI), including the FY26 Fiscal Agent Agreement and Coordination Contracts for both Together for Families and the FMC region.

Supervisors also approved a utility permit for Butler County REC to install underground service at 10295 Riverside Road. Additionally, the board authorized the County Engineer to sign the Iowa DOT Agreement 2024-DERA-06.

An engineer's update was provided, and claims were approved before the board adjourned.
