Staff is recommending approval of the audio and surveillance equipment installation with RC Tech in the amount of \$9,573.55. Motion made by Engel, seconded by Andresen to approve the audio and surveillance quote from RC Tech. Motion carries.	
Discussion and Consideration Pay Application #1 – Uptown Lighting Improvement – Council Action as Needed Significant progress has been made with the Uptown Lighting Project. The lights are scheduled for delivery and installation next week. Pay application #1 is in the amount of \$212,604.78. Motion made by Tuerler, seconded by West to approve Pay Application #1-Uptown Lighting Improvement. Motion carries.	
Discussion and Consideration of Retiree Cobra Guidelines Under Iowa Code 509(A) – Council Action as Needed. Iowa Code 509(A) allows employees that meet the definition of “early retiree” to continue under the health, dental and vision insurance umbrella of the City until the age of 65. Retirees are responsible for the full amount of each monthly premium. The early retiree program would be offered in lieu of Cobra Insurance. The question the City Council must consider is whether to extend this benefit to the early retiree’s spouse and/or qualifying children. Iowa Code 509(A) specifies that each employer will determine whether to extend the benefit beyond the early retiree. In Mount Vernon’s case, this has become less of an issue since the City has joined the much larger IGACP insurance pool. Council agreed that this was a good benefit to provide employees at no cost to the City. Any future Council can reconsider this option at any time. Motion made by Rose, seconded by Tuerler to approve extending the retiree guidelines to the employee’s spouse. Motion carries.

Protect your property and your wallet by getting the proper building permits

As Linn County celebrates Building Safety Month, our Planning & Development Department is seeing an increase in calls from insurance companies seeking proof of building permits before approving damage claims. This increase in calls highlights the critical importance of obtaining proper permits – not just as a procedural requirement, but as a key factor in protecting property, ensuring personal safety, and maintaining valid insurance coverage.

Building permits are designed to ensure that construction and renovation projects meet local safety standards and building codes. These permits not only protect homeowners

from substandard work but also preserve the structural integrity of their homes. When homeowners bypass the permitting process, they introduce unknown risks that insurers may not be willing to cover.

“Building permits play an important role in helping ensure that construction projects meet safety standards. We’re starting to see insurance companies take notice when projects are completed without proper permits, which can complicate coverage and claims,” said Linn County Planning & Development Director Charlie Nichols.

Before starting any home improvement or construction project, homeowners

should check with their local building department to determine whether a permit is required. Linn County Planning & Development issues building permits for properties located in unincorporated Linn County. Residents in need of a building permit can apply online. Planning & Development staff can also assist property owners in verifying that contractors are licensed and insured, which can help mitigate potential insurance problems.
