Engineer Dillon Davenport re-

ported the following: The culvert sliplining project is complete on Hwy J46 west from Seymour and Hwy S40 south of Hwy 2 to the Missouri line. Davenport reported that he was very happy with the work of the contractor and the process. The Contractor is driving piling on 245th Street Bridge. The railcar culvert on 45th Street south of Highway 65 should be open to traffic today. The culvert crew will be moving to Cedar Rd northwest of Lineville next. The two railcars should be delivered next week and will be a lengthy project.

They are trying to locate a railcar to replace a failed multiplate culvert on Ohio Rd Northeast of Corydon in late spring 2026.
