The following official notice reports action by the Wayne County Board of Supervisors. Its publication here is required by state law as a means of informing taxpayers about county business.

Wayne County Board of Supervisors

A regular meeting of the Wayne County Board of Supervisors was held on the 16th day of September 2025, at the Wayne County Courthouse in the Lower-Level Conference Room, Corydon, Iowa, pursuant to notice duly given in compliance with the Iowa Code Section 21.4. The Board noted due notice of meeting subject to said Code Section.

Present- Chris Moore, Todd Wilson, and Lance Lange members of the Board. Also in attendance: Kim Crawford, CJ McMurtry, Chase Clark, Kellie Anderson, Dan Capenter, Dillon Davenport, Don Seams, Teresa Evans, and Michelle Dooley. Unless otherwise noted, all motions are approved unanimously by all Board members present.

Moore called the meeting to order at 10:00AM and took roll call.

Pledge of Allegiance.

Wilson made a motion to approve the agenda but striking item#10, seconded by Lange. Wilson made a motion to approve September 2, 2025, Regular Meeting Minutes, seconded by Lange.

Lange made a motion to approve September 12, 2025, payroll, seconded by Wilson. Lange made a motion to approve September 16, 2025, claim set, seconded by Wilson. No public comments on agenda items.

Lange made a motion to approve \$25,000 from the OPIOID Funds in FY26 to Circle of Freedom located in Seymour, Iowa, seconded by Wilson.

Wilson made a motion to approve \$25,000 from the OPIOID Funds in FY26 to The Refuge located near Winterset, Iowa, seconded by Lange.

Wilson made a motion to approve the following safety training courses for all employees, seconded by Lange.

Wilson made a motion to approve Chase Clark to move forward with Axis Platform for card access system and security cameras.

Engineer Dillon Davenport reported the following:

The culvert sliplining project is complete on Hwy J46 west from Seymour and Hwy S40 south of Hwy 2 to the Missouri line. Davenport reported that he was very happy with the work of the contractor and the process. The Contractor is driving piling on 245th Street Bridge. The railcar culvert on 45th Street south of Highway 65 should be open to traffic today. The culvert crew will be moving to Cedar Rd northwest of Lineville next. The two railcars should be delivered next week and will be a lengthy project.

They are trying to locate a railcar to replace a failed multi-plate culvert on Ohio Rd Northeast of Corydon in late spring 2026. The durapatcher is working on prepping Hwy S60 north of Seymour to Hwy 2 for next year concrete overlay project. Then the durapatcher will move to Liberty Rd (Old Hwy 2 West). The mantis grinder has been delivered and is working it's way around all the intersections with clear visibility issues first.

Lange made a motion to approve the Capital Asset Addition of a Mantis MTS155FR w/24' telescoping boom and 60" rotary deck w/swivel purchase from Tiger Mowers LLC for \$299,888.36 with a 7-year useful life, seconded by Wilson.

Department Monthly Updates: Lange made a motion to approve the Recorder's August Report, seconded by Wilson. Deposits were \$4,216.37.

Wilson made a motion to approve the Sheriff's August Report, seconded by Lange. Deposits were \$45,703.08.

Lange made a motion to approve the Clerk of Court's August Report, seconded by Wilson. Deposits were \$492.89.

Wilson made a motion to approve the Public Health Nursing's August Report, seconded by Lange. Deposits were \$39,058.21.

Supervisor's meetings update:

Moore reported that Public Health Department is reviewing

the Meals on Wheels program. They are considering moving toward the Mom's Meal program.

Moore also reported that the liner for the two new cells being built at WRD Landfill should be installed later this week.

Lange reported that the boring at Corydon Lakeside Park is complete and work will begin on a new bathroom soon.

He also reported that Stacey Besch will be presenting information about Human Trafficking so mark your calendars on October 26, 2025 @ 7PM at the Wayne Theater located at 110 N Franklin St, Corydon Iowa.

Wilson had no scheduled meetings to report on.

Josh Crawford

Josh Crawford has been inducted into the 2025 Hampshire High School Hall of Fame, honored for a career that placed him among the program's all-time greats.

Crawford first gained recognition in 2012 when he was named to the First-Team All-Martinsburg Journal and the Cumberland Times-News All-Area squad. The following year, he elevated his game even further, earning AAA All-State Honorable Mention, a second All-Area selection, and the AMAC Player of the Year award. He also became the first—and only—Hampshire player to be named Cumberland Times-News Area Player of the Year.

During his Trojan career, Crawford collected 14 wins on

the mound, including a 7-0 senior season, and was equally effective at the plate, finishing with a .519 batting average.

Crawford continued his playing career at Potomac State College, where he spent two seasons before transferring to Fairmont State. After his college career, he transitioned into coaching, leading the Romney Post 91 American Legion team to four state tournament appearances and guiding the Appalachian Aces Collegiate Prep team for five seasons. He is currently the head coach at Seymour High School in Iowa.

Crawford's accomplishments as both a player and coach have left a lasting mark on Hampshire baseball and beyond. □
