

Warriors Ruin Twins Cedars Homecoming

The Warriors traveled to Bussey Friday night to take on the Sabers. Both teams had won their first game of the season and were looking to place another win in the victory column. The Sabers had a little extra motivation as it was their homecoming game. The Warriors started out on offense and drove the ball down the field with Drayden Miller pounding the ball into the endzone from three yards out. The conversion would fail but the visitors would take an early 6-0 lead. The Sabers would take advantage of a couple of Warrior miscues to score the next two touchdowns and they were successful on one conversion to take a 6-14 lead. Warrior’s freshman quarterback Tucker Young would find senior Gavyn Jellison on a ten yard crossing route and a successful two point conversion pass from Callon Spurgeon to Brody Young would knot the score up at 14 a piece at the end of the first quarter. The Warriors defense was able to place good pressure

on the Sabers quarterback all night but his ability to be elusive caused problems for the defense the entire first half. The Sabers QB would scramble at the beginning of the second quarter and find an open receiver and with a successful conversion take a 22-14 lead. The Warriors would come right back on their first play from scrimmage in the quarter as Young was able to hook up with Jellison again on a 50 yard pass play and Miller pushed the ball over the goal line on the conversion to tie the game up once again at 22-22. The Sabers would take the lead back on another scramble pass play and would find success on their conversion to take a 30-22 lead. The Warriors continued to battle and Miller found paydirt one more time before half on a 12 yard run but the conversion failed allowing the Sabers to take a 30-28 lead into halftime. Both teams’ defenses tightened up in the third quarter but the Warriors were able

to score on a wide receiver reverse from three yards out and with Miller scoring another conversion the Warriors took the lead 36-30 and held it into the fourth quarter. The Sabers would score again on another pass play and with a successful conversion take the lead back 38-36. Seymour’s pressure had worn down their opponents which would allow the offensive line of Callon Spurgeon, Aiden Parrish, and Brody Young to open a nice hole for Miller to score another TD from 6 yards out and Brody Young would score the conversion on a center eligible play placing the Warriors back on top by the score of 44-38. A bad snap on a Warrior punt would allow the Sabers to score a safety, tightening the Warriors lead to 44-40. The Warrior’s defense would stop Twin Cedars next drive and force them to punt. Gage Jellison would place the final nail in the coffin as he would take a lead play up the middle for a 28 yard touchdown

run and Spurgeon would run the conversion in to put Seymour up to stay making the final score Seymour 52 and Twin Cedars 40. The Warriors victory would ruin the Sabers attempt at a homecoming game victory. The Warriors are hoping to use this win as momentum for their homecoming game this Friday night as the Saints from Mormon Trail come to town. The Warriors victory gives them a 2-4 record for the season. The two wins marked the first time since 2015 that a Warrior’s varsity football team would have more than one win in a season. If the Warriors can win their game this Friday night it will be the first homecoming victory since 2016. The team would love to see a huge crowd at the field this Friday night for their homecoming game.
