

StarWatch By Gary Becker - Season of Light

Last week, I spoke about the lag of the seasons and how the Northern Hemisphere heats up during the summer months. This energy reserve influences climate until sometime in November when the change from temperate to cold takes place. There are other reasons why summertime seems to hang on a little longer than we might expect. The most significant, I believe, is the illusion created when we enter Daylight Saving Time which occurs on the second Sunday in March. We set our clocks ahead by one hour, making them tick to the rhythm of Atlantic Standard Time. The sun rises an hour later, and therefore, sets an hour later. Since most of us are still in bed or not quite coherent when the EDT sun rises, it seems as if we have gained an extra hour of daylight without even considering a later sunrise. This time change aligns our waking hours more accurately with the sun's visibility. I'm an advocate of making Daylight Saving Time our standard time all year long, just on that fact alone. Sadly, EDT will end on Sunday, November 2, with the period repeating from 1 a.m. to 2 a.m., and we will fall back to standard time. The earliest sunset for the Lehigh Valley will occur at approximately 4:34 p.m. on December 7, 2025. Yuk! * You might be a little confused here because the winter solstice and summer solstice represent the shortest and longest sunlit times of the year. Although June 20 was the summer solstice and the longest day of the year, the latest sunset just transpired on Friday, June 27. The reason the solstices are not in synchronization with the earliest sunrise and the latest sunset times is due to the change in the Earth's orbital speed as it revolves around the sun. In addition, the sun's increasing and decreasing noontime altitude resulting from Earth's axial tilt must also be considered. For the sake of simplicity, consider the Earth's rotational (spin) constant at 23 hours and 56 minutes. We do not have to account for the sun's changing altitude because near the solstices, the sun's distance above the horizon at noon is nearly constant... Read more at www.astronomy.org
