Davis County Community School District has entered into a grant agreement with the Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) under the State Energy Program, effective April 25, 2025. The grant provides \$97,189.72 in funding to support the procurement of mobile solar emergency response trailers and cell phone charging lockers. These resources are intended to enhance energy resilience and emergency preparedness within lowa communities

Each trailer will be equipped with a 30kWh battery, solar array, inverter, and light pole. The District will ensure that at least three staff members are trained in the operation, maintenance, and deployment

of the trailer. In addition, the District will coordinate delivery to the designated communities of Roland and Kalona and will report performance metrics to IEDA at the conclusion of the grant period.
