3. Board Policy - First Reading The Board held a first reading of updates to various board policies to reflect recent changes in lowa legislation and regulatory requirements. Policies 104, 104.E1, 104. E2, and 104.E3 (Anti-Bullying/Anti-Harassment) were revised to align with HF 865, which updated the definition of bullying and harassment.
Policy 211 (Open Meetings) was amended in response to HF 706, requiring mandatory training on lowa's open meetings and public records laws for new board members. Policy 402.02 (Child Abuse Reporting) was updated to generalize training requirements for mandatory reporters. Policy 402.03 (Abuse of Students by School District Employees) reflects changes under SF 659, shifting investigative authority to the lowa Department of Health and Human

Policy 405.02 and Policy 411.02 (Licensed and Classified Employee Qualifications, Recruitment, and Selection) were updated to reflect HF 787, which designates Teachlowa.gov as the required statewide job posting site. Policies 501.03, 501.09, and 501.09R1 (Compulsory Attendance, Chronic Absenteeism and Truancy, and its Regulation) were revised based on HF 870 and SF 277, which update attendance exemptions, including those for religious instruction, and adjust truancy notification and engagement meeting procedures.

Policy 507.01 (Student Health and Immunization Certificates) now includes language required by HF 299 and SF 175 regarding exemption information and additional content in human growth and development instruction. Finally, instructional policies 603.01 (Basic Instructional Program) and 603.05 (Health Education) were updated to incorporate legislative mandates from HF 316 and SF 175 regarding career exploration and expanded health education content related to human development and fetal im-

As this was a first reading, no action was taken. Final approval will be considered at a future meeting. 4. Board Policy - Emergency

Reading Move to approve emergency reading of board policy.

Mr. Philips, High School Principal, presented an emergency reading of the revised Graduation Requirements policy (Policy 505.05). The updated policy reflects legislative changes from SF 369, requiring that, beginning with the 2026-2027 school year, all high school students must pass a civics test developed by the Iowa Department of Education

based on the U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services exam. Students must achieve a minimum score of 60%, and once passed, the requirement is fulfilled without need for retesting.

Additional policy revisions include phased increases in the total number of credits required for graduation: 48 credits for the Class 2026, 50 credits for the Class of 2027, and 52 credits beginning with the Class of 2028. The required coursework includes specified credits in English/Language Arts (8), Science (6), Mathematics (6), Social Studies (6, including American History and Government), Physical Education (2), Health (1), Financial Literacy (1), and Career Readiness (1 beginning with the Class of 2025). Students must also receive guidance on completing the

The policy maintains provisions for credit recognition related to participation in the Legislative Page Program and Junior Officers' Training Corps, and continues to include adjusted requirements for students receiving special education services. The Board conducted this emergency reading to ensure compliance with legislative timelines.

The Board met with Engineer Ryan Schock, who reported on the blading, mowing, rock hauling and ditching work being completed by the County crews.

The Board met with Davis County Veterans Memorial Committee member (DCVMC), Nick Morton who was present to inform the Board of DCVMC's desire to erect a veteran's memorial wall on the east side of the Courthouse. The proposed seven by 15-foot wall (not including expansion wings) would be constructed of landscaping bricks with engraved one by two-inch plates containing the name, rank, service and service dates of each veteran. Morton stated funding for said wall would come from the donations of businesses and individuals, the goal being that veterans would not have to pay to have their name placed on the wall. The Board requested addition time to consider the wall and get input from citizens. No action was taken.

At 9:45 a.m., David Henderson moved, seconded by Ron Bride and by roll call vote as follows: David Henderson, aye; Ron Bride, aye; Alan Yahnke, aye, carried unani-mously, to go into closed session with County Attorney Rick Lynch regarding imminent litigation matters where its disclosure would be likely to prejudice or disadvantage the position of the governmental body in that litigation, pursuant to Iowa Code Section 21.5(1)(c).
