



NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

IN RE: Proposed Vacation of County Road October 20, 2025

The Davis County Board of Supervisors, acting under the authority of Iowa Code Chapter 306, proposes to vacate a section of Davis County Secondary Road, described as follows:

The entire portion of Franklin Avenue A/K/A Crimson Ave and the entire portion of Mill Street A/K/A 186th Street located in Section 9, Township 70 North, Range 15 West, in Davis County, Iowa. The intention of this road closure is to vacate the entire segment of both public roads (original and with modifications) commencing at the intersection of Bunch Road & Franklin Avenue A/K/A Crimson Ave and continuing North to Mill Street A/K/A 186th Street, approximately 0.061 miles (323 feet), measured along the centerline of Franklin Avenue A/K/A Crimson Ave and then East to King Avenue A/K/A Cobalt Avenue, approximately 0.044 miles (234 feet), measured along the centerline of Mill Street A/K/A 186th Street.

A hearing will be held by the Davis County Board of Supervisors in their office, Davis County Courthouse, Bloomfield, Iowa 52537 on Monday, November 3, 2025, at nine (9) o'clock a.m. Any person owning land abutting on the road proposed to be vacated and closed shall have the right to file, in writing, a claim for damages at any time on or before the date and time fixed for the hearing.
