5. Administrative reports

October 20, 2025 Administration Report District Level

Superintendent Christiansen shared an overview of the SWOT analysis process conducted across the district to guide improvement planning. The process included the identification, discussion, and prioritization of more than 60 district strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats. This work led to the selection of four key initiatives for the 2025–2026 school year: development of a new district vision through SIAC collaboration among staff, parents, community, and board members; establishment of measurable academic achievement goals within each building and department, with regular reporting of progress at monthly board meetings; reduction of chronic absenteeism from 14% to 11% by the end of the 2025–26 school year through communication, relationship-building, and progress monitoring; and continued implementation and monitoring of the Teach to Heal program, with benchmarks and coaching support tailored to each building's stage of progress.

District-Level Curriculum and Instruction

Administration reported that the district, in partnership with the AEA, has launched a new data dashboard to analyze ISASP results and chronic absenteeism trends. Staff members are exploring how to use these reports to guide instructional and system-level decision-making. The district continues professional development in the Teach to Heal framework, with creator Danielle Theis visiting on October 22–23 for walkthroughs and support. Additional staff will attend regional training in Ottumwa next week.

Building-Level Reports

At Davis County High School, former student Abby Warning was recognized as a Presidential Scholar, one of only two recipients in the state of Iowa. The Senior Buddies Program has been very successful, pairing approximately 60 seniors with 60 kindergarten students to foster mentorship, community connection, and positive culture, highlighted by a recent visit to Grandma's Pumpkin Patch. The high school's Soil Judging Team placed 8th in the state. Attendance data show improvement, with only 3% of students missing more than 10% of school days compared to 4% last year. Academic progress continues, with approximately 95% of classes passed, and the "F" list" has steadily decreased from 130 to 86 over a four-week period. The building continues to implement Teach to Heal practices through staff collaboration and coaching.

At Davis County Middle School, Homecoming Week activities were a success, thanks to the DCMS Student Council and Mrs. VanWinkle. Chronic absenteeism decreased from 20% in 2023–24 to 17% last year, with a goal to reduce the rate to 14% this year. The implementation of traditional grading continues to improve communication with parents, and PLT groups are collaborating to support student learning and makeup work. Teach to Heal implementation is progressing, with Danielle Theis scheduled to review building-level growth and next steps.

At Davis County Elementary School, the building's attendance goal is to reduce chronic absenteeism from 11% to 8%, improving upon results already better than the state average of 15.8%. In the area of student achievement, 90% of K–4 teachers are expected to meet

"Developing" or "Robust" indicators on the Benchmark Advance Implementation Rubric. The building's Teach to Heal goal is for 100% of PK–4 teachers to reach "Progressing" or "Met Implementation" levels, with walkthroughs scheduled October 22–23 to assess progress. The Elementary Discovery Room continues to receive positive feedback and may soon serve as a model site for other districts. Office referrals have decreased by 15% from the 2023–24 school year.

Activities and Athletics

Administration noted upcoming events including volleyball regionals, cross country state qualifiers, dance and color guard state qualifying meets, and the fall choir concert and band shadow night. Homecoming Week participation was strong across all grade levels. Congratulations were extended to Mr. Merck, Mr. Phillips, Mr. Taylor, and Mr. Mason, the Iron Man Volleyball Champions.

6. Presentation by Van Mersbergen Insurance

Wayne Van Mersbergen presented information about the EMC dividend of \$15,345.58. This has been the first time in 6 years the district has received a dividend from the program.

12. Presentation by Shive-Hattery for MS/EL HVAC

Danny Roberts, Support Services Coordinator and Shive-Hattery provided an update on the district's ongoing facilities planning efforts for the Elementary and Middle School HVAC and building improvement project. The proposed phasing plan outlines work beginning in summer 2026 and extending through summer 2027, ensuring minimal disruption to classroom instruction while coordinating key infrastructure upgrades.

During summer 2026, the district will begin installation of the geothermal well field, tie the dock area roof drains into the storm sewer, and start main piping installation within the elementary school corridors, including conduit work for new electrical panels and fire-alarm systems. Ceiling grid removal and replacement will occur during this phase, along with preparation for future classroom connections.

During the 2026–2027 school year, construction will proceed in small, phased segments of three to four elementary classrooms at a time, each lasting approximately six to eight weeks. Work will include window replacement, wall infill, flooring patching, HVAC installation, ceiling replacement, electrical updates, and fire-alarm upgrades. Mechanical room equipment installation and limited roof modifications will also occur during periods when students are not in the building.

At the middle school, main piping will be installed in the tunnels, with classroom HVAC and ductwork completed during early-out days, no-school days, and weekends to reduce noise and disruption.

During summer 2027, the remaining elementary classrooms, media center, and main office will be completed, along with middle school window replacement, wall infill, ceiling and floor patching, and full HVAC and electrical connections. Final phases include installation of the mechanical room equipment, connection of head-end fire-alarm equipment, and door replacements district-wide.

Roofing work will be scheduled separately once system phasing and weather considerations are finalized.

The board reviewed the construction schedule diagrams and phasing charts, which illustrate the sequence of work by classroom and building area, ensuring that instructional spaces remain operational throughout the project. The detailed schedule provides clear visibility into how both the elementary and middle school HVAC projects will proceed in coordination with district operations.
