continue to tighten due to declining enrollment and reduced liquidity. Cash on hand has decreased from 122 days in FY21 to a projected 72 days in FY25, below the 90-day benchmark, and the Financial Solvency Ratio has declined to a projected 7.07%. Employee costs remain within normal ranges at 75.5% of General Fund expenditures, and the district's unspent balance ratio remains healthy at 19.33%. Enrollment continues to trend downward, contributing to higher-than-average per-pupil costs. The report emphasized the need to monitor staffing levels, align expenditures to enrollment, and utilize the cash reserve levy strategically to maintain financial stability.
