# Wildcats end with best post season showing since 2020

The Columbus Volleyball season came to end on October 22 in a 2A Region One against Quarterfinal Bellevue, but not before Lady Wildcats had won a first round match against Louisa-Muscatine in a contest Columbus had hosted on October 20.

With the loss the Wildcats finished with an overall record 11-16. Bellevue moved to 16-10, and moved on to face Cascade (18-12) in a Region One Semifinal contest at Bellevue on October 27.

#### **SUCCESSFUL SENIOR GROUP**

The loss to the Comets ended the high school careers of Columbus seniors Jocelyn Hernandez, Jessica Del Rio, Daniela Diaz, Addison Marin, Hailey Wellington, and Kennedy Woepking.

Those six seniors were a part of a program

that won 11 contests this season and in 2024, the most since the 2020 squad won 12; had back-to-back double digit winning seasons, something that hasn't happened since at least prior to 2008.

Also, this was the second consecutive year that the Wildcats had reached the Regional Quarterfinals, the best postseason showing since the 2020 season.

The second place finish by the Lady Wildcats, with its 7-1 record in the SEISC North Division, was the best record for the program since, again, at least 2008.

### LOUISA-**MUSCATINE**

Hosting the first round matchup, the Wildcats rolled to a three-set victory over North Division opponent Louisa-Muscatine, 25-21, 25-18, 25-20, in front of an energetic Columbus crowd on October 20.

The Wildcats, who lost to Louisa-Muscatine back on August 25, beat the Falcons for the second consecutive time this season, and move to 11-14. Louisa-Muscatine finishes their season at 14-13.

Zai Par brought her A game from serve as she led the Lady Wildcats from the back row, going 21-21 with five Aces. The Wildcats as a team were 69-75 from serve, a strong 92.0% with seven Aces.

Jocelyn Hernandez was 13-13 from serve, and Daniela Diaz was 11-11; both played major roles in other parts of the match for Columbus.

Hernandez had 20 digs, and Diaz had 33 assists and recorded seven digs. Hernandez had two kills. Par, along with her tremendous night from serve, had 11 digs, and an assist.

Kennedy Woepking was all over the court for the Wildcats, leading the way with 14 kills, and tied with Hernandez with 20 digs. She was 9-10 from serve with an Ace, and had an assist.

Jessica Del Rio had nine kills, eight digs, and was 7-10 from serve. Hailey Wellington had nine kills, a dig, and a block. Maeleigh Grimm had two kills, a block and a dig.

As a team the Wildcats recorded 70 digs and 38 kills, outdistancing the Falcons in both categories, 66 to 31, respectively. Louisa-Muscatine was 51-60 from serve (85.0%) with seven Aces.

Madelyn Payne was 8-10 from serve with an Ace, and a dig. Kaylee McCullough had a block and a dig.

#### **BELLEVUE**

Hitting the road to battle the Comets in a Region One Quarterfinal, the Wildcats fell to Bellevue (16-10) straight sets, 10-25, 18-25, and 14-25 on October

Both teams were outstanding from serve, with Bellevue successful on 95.9% (71-74), and the Wildcats at 95.3%, but had substantially less attempts, 41-43. Where the Comets dominated was 37-18 in kills, 40-19 in assists, and a slight 53-47 advantage on digs.

Diaz finished off her career going 6-6 from serve, with 17 assists, 10 digs, and a kill.

Hernandez had 18 digs, a perfect 7-7 from serve, and Del Rio was 7-7 from serve, an Ace, nine kills, five digs, an assist, and a block.

Woepking was 10-11 from serve, with an Ace, five digs, and four kills. Wellington rounded out the seniors, statistically, with three kills.

Zai Par and Payne exceptional evenings as well, with Zai collecting eight digs, a kill, an assist, and was perfect from serve at 4-4; Payne was 7-8 from serve with a dig.
