Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: All

three Supvs attended the Floyd County Fair at various times. Carr also attended meetings for ADC Asset Management and Northeast Iowa Workforce Development and noted an HR issue is resolved.

Auditor Montagne introduced Jen Sheehan and Starla Varrelman with Central Iowa Community Services, who are seeking office space in the courthouse. Montagne recommended a previous County Social Service office. Neupert/Carr moved to approve CICS utilizing office space in previous CSS office area. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr/Neupert moved to approve the allowance of 159 Homestead Tax Credit, 84 Homestead Exemption, 11 Disabled Veteran Homestead Property Tax Credit, and 17 Military Service Property Tax Exemption applications and to disallow two Homestead Tax Credit, one Homestead Exemption, one Disabled Veteran Homestead Property Tax Credit and one Military Service Property Tax Exemption applications. Motion carried 3-0.

Carr updated the board on the Workforce Development merger including the South Central area is working with the Mississippi Valley area to merge by October 1. The Northeast Iowa area would like to merge but believes doing so by Oct 1 is too soon and is working toward July 1, 2026 if the 20-county members agree
