In the book of Matthew, we find three times where Jesus is instructing His followers that He would be killed and rise again. Matthew 16:21 "From that time forth began Jesus to shew unto his disciples, how that he must go unto Jerusalem, and suffer many things of the elders and chief priests and scribes and be killed, and be raised again the third day." As we read that verse, we Scripture. In Luke chapter 23 we read where Jesus stood before Pilate and was declared faultless, yet He was handed over to be crucified. In I Corinthians 15:3-4 we read why Jesus died. 3 "For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures; 4 And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:" Why did Jesus die? He died for our sins, because of our sins. He did what no other man could do. He paid the penalty for our sin;

only Jesus could do that. As we remember Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, remember that Jesus has done exactly as He predicted! It was all God's plan of Salvation. It was because of our sin, the sin that had separated us from God. I pray that you have accepted Christ, God's Son, by faith as your Savior to receive the forgiveness
