Ordinance NO. #5-2025 - City of Thompson ORDINANCE NO. #5-2025

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF THOMPSON, IOWA BY AMENDING SECTIONS 165.08, 165.13 & 165.20 REGURDING PROHIBITED USED IN CLASS A RESIDENTIAL AND INDUSTRIAL ZONING DISTRICTS AND REQUIRING A PERMIT FOR EXCAVATING

BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Thompson, Iowa: SECTION 1. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 165.08 of the Code of Ordinances of the City

of Thompson, Iowa, is amended to add the following subsection: 165.08 CLASS A RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT.

6. POND REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall construct or make improvements to any pond located in the City, including any enlargement, dredging or modifications of an existing pond. This prohibition applies to all ponds including without limitation, those ponds

utilized for drainage, recreation, aesthetics, sediment control, and fish management. 2. Definition. As used in this Section, a pond means any outdoor excavation

capable of containing in excess of two (2) feet of water at its deepest point and is less than 20,000

square feet. SECTION 2. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 165.13 of the Code of Ordi-

nances of the City of Thompson, Iowa, is amended to add the following subsection: 165.13 CLASS A INDUSTRIAL DISTRICT.

7. Cement or Concrete Crushing Prohibited. No cement or concrete crushing is Permitted. SECTION 3. SECTION MODIFIED. Section 165.20 of the Code of Ordinance

of Thompson, Iowa, is amended to substitute the following paragraph for

the first paragraph under that section:

"It is unlawful to commence or to proceed with the erection, construction, reconstruction, alteration, enlargement, extension, excavation, or moving of any building,

structure, or any portion thereof, or with excavation regulated by the Code of Ordinances,

having applied in writing to the Clerk for a building permit to do so, and until

a building permit has been granted therefor as prescribed herein."

SECTION 3. REPEALER. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the

Provisions of this ordinances are hereby repealed. SECTION 4. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision, or part of

this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the

ordinance as a whole or any section, provision, or part thereof not adjudged unconstitutional

SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final
