flow," said Officer Duane Ollendick, the department's who has been spearheading the event for more than a decade. Officers guided kids through a series of courses, from figure-8s to coned paths, giving them the opportunity to practice their riding while getting a refresher on bicycle safety and the rules of the road.

"It's just a good event for the kids," said Ollendick. "It keeps them occupied and gets them some exercise." Kids could also get their bikes registered with the Police Department in order to make it easier to return to their owner in case they are lost or stolen. Giving the police a helping hand, volunteers from Zoetis provided a maintenance station to help kids make sure their bikes are tuned up for the summer. Even those without bikes had incentive to come, with

door prizes and giveaway drawings distributing several new bicycles. Howard County Sheriff's Office was assisted at the scene of the incident by the Iowa State Patrol, Cresco Police Department, Winneshiek County Sheriff's Office, Howard County Sheriff's Emergency Management and the Iowa Division of Criminal Investigation. "This is an ongoing investigation," the DCI report stated. According to the criminal complaints filed in court, Zweibohmer used one or more firearms to live rounds at

the officers during the incident. The documents allege that officer and witness accounts, along with video evidence from body and dash cameras, support the charges. Howard County Deputy Gatlin Keehner, who filed all four complaints, stated in the documents that Zweibohmer's documents were intentional and could have resulted in death. Zweibohmer appeared for an initial hearing Thursday morning before Magistrate Joseph Haskovc, who set bail at \$100,000 cash only. Zweibohmer is being held in the Winneshiek County Jail, according to the Winneshiek County Sheriff's Office.

A preliminary hearing was set for 11:30 a.m. June 9, although preliminary hearings are canceled if the county attorney files an indictment, in which case a date for arraignment is set. Each of the four charges is a Class B felony under Iowa Code, punishable by a prison sentence of up to 25 years on each count. Iowa Code sets special circumstances for conviction of attempted murder of a peace officer while performing official duties, requiring any sentence that is given to be served in its entirety without the possibility of parole, work release or other early release.

by the county will be \$271,321. Motion carried 3-0.

Miller presented the 2025 Floyd County Pavement/Maintenance Deco Proposal. Campbell/Carr moved to approve the maintenance contract with Deco in the amount of \$289,421.24 for the following projects: PCC crack fill on T-24 and Quail/210th Street; HMA crack fill on S70 North, S70 South (with 50% of the cost shared by Floyd County), and missed sections on T26 and T38; and HMA slurry leveling on T64 North, T64 South, including culvert replacement areas on T64 South. Motion carried 3-0.

The Board discussed missing animal guards on mutual tile lines. Merlyn Schweizer expressed interest in knowing the locations of the 15 animal guards installed by Bolton & Menk. Carr stated that, according to the contract, Bolton & Menk was responsible for replacing only the animal guards that were present at the start of the project. John Zimmerman noted that a two-foot diameter corrugated pipe off T38, located under the railroad trestle, is missing an animal guard. The Secondary Roads Department is willing to install the remaining mutual guards. The Board took no action.

The Board discussed needed repairs in Drainage District #18. Keifer requested a quote from Jeff Kisch. The Board also considered other contractors and discussed defining project parameters to ensure consistent bids. Tim Laube, Secondary Roads Superintendent, confirmed the area involves both main tile and open ditch, with tree removal limited to the open ditch.

The board discussed repairs in Drainage District #7 including a 3-foot hole over a 15" main tile. Carr/Campbell moved to approve secondary roads to repair Drainage District #7 tile. Motion carried 3-0.

The board noted the resignation of Jailer, Jessica Riviera effective May 11. Future agenda items: DD #3 and #18, Review Aerial Service report, Decat Coordination Contract, Child Support Recovery Contract.

Campbell/Carr moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
