PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of Howard County in the State of Iowa, will hold a public hearing on May 27, 2025, at 9:00 A.M. in the Su-pervisors Room, Howard County Court-house, 137 North Elm Street, Cresco, Iowa, at which meeting the Board proposes to at which meeting the Board proposes to take action on the proposal to enter into an Agreement for Private Development (the "Agreement") with Upper Iowa Ag, LLC (the "Developer").

The Agreement would obligate the Devel oper to construct certain Minimum Improve-ments (as defined in the Agreement) on certain real property located within the County (the "Development Property"), consisting of the expansion and renovation of an existing office and warehouse facility on the Development Property, including the construction of an approximately 10,000 square foot expansion of the existing facility (hereinafter referred to as the "Minimum Improvements"), which expansion and re-model will permit Developer to hire

model will permit Developer to hire additional employees in its operations on the Development Property. The Agreement would further obligate the County to make up to three (3) annual pay-ments of Economic Development Grants to Developer, payable from and secured solely and only by property taxes received

by the County from levies upon the Development Property and improvements thereon, in excess of the January 1, 2024 assessment value (the "County-Only Prop-erty Taxes"), under the terms of the Agree ment. The maximum aggregate amount of the Economic Development Grants that may the Economic Development Ordins marinaly be paid to the Developer under the Agree-ment shall not exceed the lesser of: [i] \$50,000; or (ii) the cumulative amount of the County-Only Property Taxes over the three-year period. A copy of the Agreement is on file for public inspection during regular business

public inspection during regular business hours in the office of the County Auditor,

Advised County Courthouse, Cresco, Iowa. At the above meeting the Board shall re-ceive oral or written objections from any resident or property owner of said County, to the proposal to enter into the Agreement with the Developer. After all objections have been received and considered, the Board will at this meeting or at any adjourn-ment thereof, take additional action on the proposal or will abandon the proposal to authorize said Agreement.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CRESCO, IOWA, BY AMENDING

PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO WATER SERVICE SYSTEM BE IT ENACTED by the City Council of the City of Cresco, Iowa, as

ORDINANCE NO. 523

WATER SERVICE SYSTEM

SECTION 1. SECTIONS MODIFIED. Chapter 90.11 in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Cresco, Iowa, is repealed and the following adopted in lieu thereof: 90.11 INSTALLATION OF WATER SERVICE PIPE.

Water service pipes from the main to

the meter setting shall be Type K copper or Polyethylene pipe (PE). If Polyethylene pipe is used, the following specifications are also required: (1) the pipe shall be rated for a minimum of 250 psi; (2) the pipe shall be ³/₄" or 1" IPS; (3) compression fittings and stainless steel stiffeners shall be used or all connections; and (4) a tracer wire and iconnections; and (4) a tracer wire and terminal box, ground rod, and clamp shall be installed with the pipe so that the pipe can be located when necessary, as well as any other requirements that the Citv may prescribe. The use of any other pipe material for the service line shall first be approved by the Water Superintendent. Pipe must be laid sufficiently waving, and to such depth, as to prevent rupture from settlement or freezing. SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If

any section, provision or part of this ordi-

nance shall be adjudged invalid or uncon-stitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional. SECTION 3. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This

Gardiner + Company P.C. today re-leased an audit report on Howard County,

FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS:

The County's revenues totaled \$17,783,973 for the year ended June 30, 2024, a 9.93% increase from the prior year. Expenses for County operations for the year ended June 30, 2024 totaled \$13,605,012, a 2.63% decrease from the prior year.

AUDIT FINDINGS:

Gardiner + Company reported six find-ings related to the receipt and expenditure

of taxpayer funds. They are found on pages 81 and 86 of this report. The find-ings address issues such as lack of segregation of duties, the County Treasurer's Office and material amounts of receipts, accounts receivable, accounts payable, de ferred inflows of resources and capital asset and construction in progress additions and not properly recorded in the County's financial statements. Gardiner + Company provided the County with recom mendations to address each of these find-

ings. Three of the findings discussed above which relate to the County are repeated

from the prior year. The County Board of Supervisors have a fiduciary responsibility to provide oversight of the County's opera tions and financial transactions. Oversight is typically defined as the "watchful and responsible care" a governing body exer-cises in its fiduciary capacity.
