Elma City Council

The Elma City Council meeting was opened by Mayor Thoren at 7:00 PM in the Elma Community Complex meeting room. The meeting was opened with roll call. Laura Schroeder, present, Emily Ptacek, present, Myron Head, present, Andrew Casler, present, Josh Smith, absent.

There were two changes to the agenda. Liquor license approval for Elma Locker and Grocery needed to be added and the building permit for Don Havlik could be removed. Laura moved the agenda with the two changes be approved, seconded by Andrew, carried.

Laura moved the minutes of the June 9th meeting be approved, seconded by Emily, carried.

Andrew moved the liquor license for Elma Locker and Grocery be approved, seconded by Emily, carried.

Laura moved the claims be approved, seconded by Emily, carried.

Mayor Thoren opened the public hearing at 7:03 for the Code of Ordinances update. Discussion was that Elma's ordinances had not had a full update since 2012. The city has been working with Upper Explorerland to get the ordinances up to date with State codes and changes that the city has made over the years. One question asked was when the new ordinances be in effect. Pending approval at this meeting, the ordinances will be in effect when published and that should be Wednesday, July 23rd in the Cresco Times Plain Dealer. One other question asked was if the city will be doing anything to get people to get rid of the junk and junk vehicles that have been accumulating. Yes, the City will be working on getting properties cleaned up. There were no further questions or comments for the public hearing. Emily made a motion to close the public hearing, seconded by Laura, the hearing was closed at 7:14.

Shannon read aloud the ordinances to be updated by title and chapter. Title one, General Provisions, Chapter 1, General Provisions, Chapter 2, Right of Entry, Chapter 3, Penalty, Chapter 4, Procedure for hearings by the City Council, Title 2, Chapter 1, City Charter, Chapter 2, Appointment and Qualifications of Municipal Officers, Chapter 3, Powers and Duties of Municipal Officers, Chapter 4, Salaries of Municipal Officers, Chapter 5, City Finance, Chapter 6, Posting of Notice, Chapter 7, City Elections. Title 3, Community Protection, Chapter 1, Offenses, Chapter 2, Nuisances, Chapter 3 Traffic Code, Chapter 4, Fire Protection, Chapter 5, Reserved, Chapter 6 Park Regulations, Chapter 7, Regulating Peddlers, Solicitors and Transient Merchants, Chapter 8 Drug Paraphernalia, Chapter 9, Alcoholic Beverages, Chapter 10, Junk and Abandoned Vehicles, Chapter 11, Fireworks Ordinance.

Cresco City Council

Mayor Fortune called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on July 21, 2025 at 5:30 pm. Council Members Carman, Bouska, Fosaaen, McConnell, and Kriener were present. No council members were absent.

Bouska made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes from the July 7, 2025 meeting. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Brenno reported: (a) the public works staff had a safety training on backhoe safety, respiratory hazards, and general equipment safety; (b) Street Dept is chip sealing and they will be replacing the storm sewer by Subway this week; (c) sidewalk in front of Leutholds was replaced last week under warranty from the Downtown Crosswalk project; (d) emailed out information on how other cities handle dumpsters and roll offs on streets; (e) reminded the public to not flush the "flushable" wipes in the toilets and to keep grass clippings off the street.

Police Chief Ruroden had nothing to report for the police department.

City Clerk Hill reported: (a) updated the ward maps on the website; (b) first online open meetings training will be August 15th from 12:1-3:30 pm. This is a new requirement for all members of governmental bodies that were appointed after July 1, 2025; (c) the next hazard mitigation meeting is August 6th at 5:30 pm; (d) August 12th will be a goal setting open house from 4-7 pm for the comp plan update. This is open to the public and encourage all to attend.

McConnell reported on the Park Board meeting. They interviewed for the open board position. They have completed their alarm system upgrade and new carpets have been installed in the lobby and hall-way area. They are looking at replacing the files around the spa area next. A local employer unfortunately stopped allowing membership fees to be deducted from paychecks, which results in the loss of several members. There are 189 24/7 memberships. They also discussed allowing the pickleball players to have a shed at the court and the board was not in favor of it. Council will be provided an update on the new building project this fall. Andrew moved to waive the 3rd reading of the Code of Ordinances, seconded by Myron, carried.

Ordinance No. 20250714 states that the purpose of this ordinance is to enable the City of Elma, Iowa, to comply with the provisions of Section 362.3 and 380.8 of the Iowa Code. All ordinances or parts thereof in force on the date of publication of this Ordinance and not contained in the City Code of the City of Elma, 2025, are hereby repealed except as herein provided. The 2025 Code of Ordinances of the City of Elma, Iowa, shall be compiled in a loose-leaf format. An official copy of the 2025 Code of Ordinances shall be kept in the City Clerk's office. Additional copies of the 2025 Code of Ordinances shall be available for public inspection and for sale at a cost to the public. All ordinances, except as hereinafter provided, adopted after the effective date of the Ordinance shall be in the form of an amendment to or an addition to the 2025 Code of Ordinance. This section does not apply to street ordinances, bond ordinances, naming streets and vacating streets and alleys.

Laura moved Ordinance No. 20250714 be approved, seconded by Andrew. Mayor Thoren requested a roll call vote. Vote is as follows: Laura, aye, Emily, aye, Myron, aye, Andrew, aye, Josh, absent, Myron, aye.

Mayor Thoren read aloud Resolution

replacing the playground equipment at Evans Park and making it more accessible were given to Council.

Mayor Fortune asked for comments from the audience and there were none.

Scott from WHKS explained that the 7th Street Reconstruction Project has been completed. They recommend the Council accept the project construction and authorize final payment to the contractor. Bouska made the motion to approve the resolution accepting work on the 7th Street West Reconstruction Project. Fosaaen seconded and it passed all ayes.

Carman made the motion to approve the resolution ordering preparation of the final plat and schedule of assessments for the 7th Street West Reconstruction. McConnell seconded and it passed all ayes.

The Final Plat and Schedule of Assessments for 7th Street West Reconstruction project was reviewed. Final assessable expenses were less than the preliminary assessment figures. The affected property owners' assessments will be approximately 12% lower than the preliminary estimate. A notice will be published twice and letters will be mailed to the property owners giving them 30 days to pay. Unpaid assessments will be added to the property taxes to be repaid over ten years with 5.1% interest.

Fosaaen made the motion to approve the resolution adopting and levying final schedule of assessments, and providing for the payment thereof. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Kriener made the motion to approve the resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into an Engagement Agreement with Ahlers and Cooney, PC to perform services for the 2025 Amended and Restated Urban Revitalization Plan. McConnell seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve the resolution authorizing the Mayor and City Clerk to enter into a minimum assessment agreement with Brenton and Sarah Holten. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve a Tax Abatement under the Urban Revitalization Plan for Cynthia M Hoines Trust. Carman seconded and it passed all ayes.

Kriener made the motion to approve the

laws:

Remove all existing concrete pavement, granular base and concrete curb and gutter on 7th Street West from Highway 9 to 4th Avenue West. The project will replace the existing 4 inch watermain along the corridor with 8 inch watermain. The existing 8" clay sanitary sewer between Highway 9 and Stock Avenue will be reconstructed with 8" PVC sanitary sewer. The existing storm sewer will also be reconstructed and discharged at a new location with a stormwater pond.

The street will be reconstructed as a 36 foot wide concrete street from Highway 9 north 500 feet then taper down to a 31 feet wide concrete street to 4th Avenue West. The roadway will include 6 inch thick concrete with integral curb over 10 inches of granular base. New concrete approaches will be constructed at existing driveway locations within the street right-of-way. Side-walk pedestrian ramps will be constructed at all intersections to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The location of the improvements is 7th Street West from Highway 9 to 4th Avenue West.
