Remove all existing concrete pavement, granular base and concrete curb and gut-ter on 7th Street West from Highway 9 to 4th Avenue West. The project will replace the existing 4 inch watermain along the corridor with 8 inch watermain. The existing 8" clay sanitary sewer between Highway 9 and Stock Avenue will be reconstructed with 8" PVC sanitary sewer. The existing storm sewer will also be reconstructed and discharged at a new location

with a stormwater pond.

The street will be reconstructed as a 36 foot wide concrete street from Highway 9 north 500 feet then taper down to a 31 feet wide concrete street to 4th Avenue West. The roadway will include 6 inch thick concrete with integral curb over 10 inches of granular base. New concrete approaches will be constructed at existing driveway lo-cations within the street right-of-way. Side-walk pedestrian ramps will be constructed at all intersections to meet the Americans with Disabilities Act.

The location of the improvements is 7th Street West from Highway 9 to 4th Avenue
