## **Drone Workshop scheduled**

IOWA - Iowa State University Extension and Outreach, in collaboration with the ISU Digital Ag Innovation Lab, will host Drone University on Thursday, Sept. 11 at the Northeast Research and Demonstration Farm near

Nashua. Designed as an introductory course, the workshop will provide growers, crop advisors and agricultural professionals with foundational knowledge on the effective use of imagery drones for improved decision-making in crop management. Participants will also gain insight into the emerging role of spray drones in modern agriculture, including practical considerations and real-world applica-

tions.

"With drone utilization continuing to expand across Iowa, especially given the extremely wet 2025 growing season, this workshop was developed to provide participants with a comprehensive understanding of both the regulatory framework and operational use cases of unmanned aerial systems (UAS)," said Ryan Huffman, senior digital agronomy research manager with the ISU Digital Ag Innovation Lab. "Drones generate high-resolution data that can significantly improve precision agriculture and support informed decision-making at the farm management level.'
