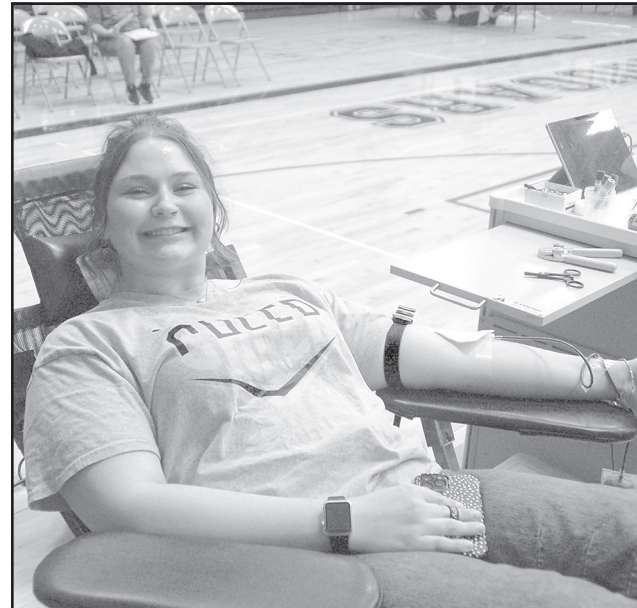


S-F NHS holds blood drive (Concluded from page 1)

A View of the Past

Nov. 14, 2024

Voters across the state of Iowa and the United States cast their ballots for the 2024 general election, which was held Tuesday, Nov. 5. The unofficial results were recently released. There were 8,306 registered voters and 6,274 ballots cast, or 75.54 percent, within Chickasaw County.

The Fredericksburg City Council met Monday, Nov. 4, for its regular meeting. The council heard from Jannette Brincks, leader for the Fredericksburg Futures 4-H Club, about the sign by the vet clinic.

The students at the middle school and high school in the S-F Community School District honored local veterans Monday, Nov. 11, with annual Veterans Day programs. The S-F Cougar football team's 2024 season wrapped up Friday night, Nov. 8, in Grundy Center. S-F battled the undefeated Grundy Center Spartans in the Class 1A quarterfinals and were defeated 6-35 to go 7-4 overall. This was the third time in school history the Cougars made it to the quarterfinal round of the state playoffs.

Nov. 12, 2015

The S-F Cougars earned a state berth to the 2015 state volleyball tournament with a solid win over the Lake Mills Bulldogs in the Class 2A regional finals. Team members can't hold back their excitement of earning the win as they hold up the state qualifying banner last Wednesday, Nov. 4.

Voters in the city of Fredericksburg made their way to the polls Tuesday, Nov. 3, for the Fredericksburg City Council election. Claiming top spot in the council member race was Dean Speicher with 138 votes and Sheriton Detpmer had 118 votes. Shaun Kroenecke was the only candidate on the ballot for the position of mayor. He earned 172 votes.

The S-F School Board met Monday, Nov. 9. Superintendent Rick Pederson reported that the official certified enrollment for S-F schools for the 2015-2016 school year increased by .89 percent, instead of decline reported earlier in the year of 11.

The S-F High School vocal department presented its annual fall variety show Thursday, Nov. 5, and Friday, Nov. 6. Briesse Johns and Markus Johns had the audience laughing during their skit, "The Perfect Cheer."

Nov. 9, 2000

According to a tentative timetable discussed at Monday night's City Council meeting, Fredericksburg could have a new City Hall in place in just over a year from now.

A recent sunny Saturday afternoon found three youngsters playing in a tree in City Park in Fredericksburg. In the tree is Lindsey Papousek and on the ground are Nicole Eichenberger and Kendra Ball.

The annual report of the Uppham Memorial Library for the 1999-2000 year was presented to the Fredericksburg City Council at their meeting Monday night.

The library is open 31 hours per week, 52 weeks per year for a total of 1,612 hours. There were 12,161 people visiting the library last year, or 7.5 people per hour.

The Fredericksburg Review becomes a subscription newspaper with this issue, going out to 469 bona fide, paid-in-advance subscribers.

Fredericksburg's Falcons placed third in overall team offense and fourth in team defense in the Cedar Wapsie Conference in the 1975 high school football season.

Prices for 200-240 pound butchers on the Iowa-southern Minnesota market have dropped about \$17 per hundredweight from the Oct. 7 peak of \$62.50 to \$63.50.

Sunday evening's severe thunderstorm produced high winds that twisted a 60-foot Scotch pine out of the ground and sent it crashing down around the double-wide mobile home of Greg and Dixie Wakeman one mile east of town.
