City Council Approves First Reading to Amend **Current Dog Ordinance**

The Hampton City Council approved the first reading to amend their current dangerous and vicious animals ordinance during their May 22 city council

meeting. They approved the first reading of Ordinance 406: An Ordinance Amending Chapter 56, Dangerous and Vicious Animals, which amends the current version they've been working under.

City Councilor Bill Holmstrom made a motion to disapprove the first reading of Ordinance 406. The motion died for lack of a second.

City Councilor Patrick Palmer then made a motion to approve the first reading of Ordinance 406. It passed, with a roll call vote.

The new version would allow the city to impound the dog sooner, adding safeguards to the ordinance.
