chise does is allow us (MEC) to operate within the city and to place our facilities within the road right of way. Franchises are good for 25 years."

With the franchise, the city gains certain rights. The right of indemnification which holds the city harmless for an issue arising from MEC equipment or services.

MEC also agrees to take care of the cost of moving any of the gas and electrical facilities and equipment.

MEC also agrees to repair to the same or better any area they are working on including pavement and grassy areas.
