GENERAL INFORMATION

## SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

This water supply obtains its water from the limestone and dolomite of the Mississippian-Devonian-Ordovician(abv St Peter) aquifer. The Mississippian-Devonian-Ordovician(abv St Peter) aquifer was determined to be slightly susceptible to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide moderate protection from contaminants at the land surface. The Mississippian-Devonian-Ordovician(aby St Peter) well will be slightly susceptible to surface contaminants such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills, and excess fertilizer application.
