PUBLIC NOTICE OF STORM WATER DISCHARGE

Greene County plans to submit a Notice of Intent to the Iowa Department of Natural Resources to be covered under the NPDES General Permit Number 2 "Storm Water Discharge Associated with Industrial Activity for Construction Activities" for public construction in Jefferson, IA.

The stormwater discharge will be from site grading associated with the construction and development of the Greene County Jail, addressed 1005 E Lincoln Way, in Jefferson, IA. There is an existing building on the property and the proposed jail is to be directly south of the existing building on the same lot. The site is located on the south side of Lincoln Way, just west of the Jefferson Cemetery. Soil disturbing activities will include the following: site clearing and grading, perimeter and other erosion and sediment controls, excavation, utility installation, commercial site construction, and the preparation for final planting and seeding. The project is located within the city limits of Jefferson, Iowa and more specifically within NE ¼ of the SE ¼ of Section 08, T-83-N, R-30-W, Greene County, Iowa.

Runoff from the proposed development will be directed to a stormwater pond, that will then be connected to the existing underground tile and the one point source. The site stormwater will ultimately drain from an outlet to underground tile to Hardin Creek to North Raccoon River.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED ACTION TO INSTITUTE PROCEEDINGS TO ENTER INTO A LOAN AGREEMENT AND TO BORROW MONEY THEREUNDER IN A PRINCIPAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000,000 (GENERAL OBLIGATION)

The City Council of the City of Jefferson, Iowa (the "City"), will meet on February 25, 2025, at the City Hall, Jefferson, Iowa, at 5:30 o'clock p.m., for the purpose of instituting proceedings and taking action on a proposal to enter into a loan agreement (the "Loan Agreement") and to borrow money thereunder in a principal amount not to exceed \$2,000,000 for the purpose of paying the costs, to that extent, of (a) constructing street, water system, sanitary sewer system, storm water drainage and sidewalk improvements; (b) acquiring and installing street lighting, signage and signalization improvements; (c) acquiring and equipping vehicles for the municipal police department; and (d) acquiring and equipping a vehicle for the municipal fire department.

The Loan Agreement is proposed to be entered into pursuant to authority contained in Section 384.24A of the Code of Iowa and will constitute a general obligation of the City.

It is estimated the annual increase in property taxes on a residential property with an actual valuation of one hundred thousand dollars resulting from the City entering into the Loan Agreement will be \$35.94 however the City Council may determine for any fiscal year while the Loan Agreement is outstanding to budget other available revenues to the payment of some or all of the debt service coming due thereunder.

At that time and place, oral or written objections may be filed or made to the proposal to enter into the Loan Agreement. After receiving objections, the City may determine to enter into the Loan Agreement, in which case, the decision will be final unless appealed to the District Court within fifteen (15) days thereafter.

The Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with the following members present: Benitz, Bardole, Gannon, Muir, Absent: Rudolph. Motion by Benitz, second by Gannon to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Benitz, second by Gannon to approve the minutes of February 3, 2025. Motion carried unanimously.

Supervisors reported on meetings attended. Supervisor Bardole attended a GCDC Executive Board meeting. Supervisor Gannon reported attending a Veteran Affairs Commissioner meeting and a Region V Hazmat meeting via zoom.

Nick Bruck with DCI Group was present to discuss the final project costs for the jail. DCI presented to the board a base bid in the amount of \$10,954,488. To date the county has paid a total of \$724,567 in design and preconstruction fees which would come off the total project cost. Leaving a difference in the project cost compared to funds remaining from the sale of bonds. The board discussed ways to make up the difference and if any changes could be made to the design to bring the overall costs down. Bruck stated that once he has the go ahead with the project that there could be changes to some portions of the project without having to change the design of the project. The board tabled any decision until all board members could be present.

Supervisors then discussed the HVAC project. Supervisors Rudolph and Bardole have a meeting with BBS Architects next week for a 95% completion update. With the jail coming in over budget, the board is concerned with being able to fund the remaining portion of the project that the ARPA funds will not cover. The board tabled any decision until more information is available.

IT/Drainage Clerk Michelle Fields reviewed the Drainage and IT/GIS proposed budget for FY26. There will be no increase in the Drainage portion of the budget which will remain at \$44,097. The IT/GIS budget did see an overall increase due to changes in the splitting of wages between different departments and increases to certain line items. Total FY26 budget request is \$206,712, which is an increase of \$3,794. No action was taken.

Auditor Billie Jo Hoskins then reviewed the non-departmental budgets for FY26. General Fund items in the non-departmental category were reviewed. General Supplemental non-departmental expenditures included various insurance line items, the largest being for employer share of health insurance, which decreased by \$25,000. They are increasing the line item for property and liability insurance by \$25,000, this line item will be reviewed later. General fund and the Dreyfus fund non-departmental expenditures requested from various non-profits were reviewed. No action was taken.

The board then reviewed the General Services FY26 budget. There will be increases to specific line items for costs of the state audit and for full-time wages for the custodian. The total FY26 budget request is \$307,233, which is an increase of \$9,111. No action was taken.

Auditor Billie Jo Hoskins then presented the General Assistance FY26 Budget. There will be no increase in budgeted line items over the last fiscal year funding, which was \$21,820. No action was taken.

Muir adjourned the meeting at 11:04 a.m.

The Greene County Board of Supervisors met at 8:30 a.m. in the courthouse boardroom with the following members present: Bardole, Benitz, Gannon, Muir, Rudolph. Motion by Bardole, second by Benitz to approve the agenda. Motion carried unanimously. Motion by Benitz, second by Gannon to approve the minutes of February 6, 2025. Motion carried unanimously.

Environmental Health Coordinator Chuck Wenhold updated the board on the North Raccoon Watershed meeting that he attended last week.

Assistant County Attorney Laura Snider updated the board on increased juvenile court activities. In the past juvenile was only once a month. It is now being held most Fridays because of the decrease in juvenile offenders accepting accountability. There is also an increase in the number of criminal defendants requesting jury trials. The County Attorney's Office has been preparing multiple cases for each trial date to ensure they are ready to move forward with another case when there is a last-minute plea or continuance. When defendants are not taking accountability for their actions, the County Attorney's Office is requesting increased sentencing ramifications. Shelly Esquer was sentenced to a five-year prison sentence last week after a jury trial conducted by County Attorney Thomas Laehn. Mark Dugan was sentenced to seven-year prison term after pleading a few days before trial.

Engineer Wade Weiss updated the board on the Grimmel Road Project. Depending on the weather, construction could resume at the end of March, with completion this summer.

Scott Peterson gave his monthly City of Jefferson update. Recycling Agency will be meeting this coming Wednesday to finalize the dissolution of the agency. 28E Agreements will be signed with each entity that is still participating. The study for the expansion of the library is nearing completion. Rural Housing Readiness Assessment is moving forward. The city is looking into creating a non-profit housing agency that will help with housing needs. They are also continuing to look at a housing re-habilitation program. Work in being done on the FY26 budget.

The board then further discussed the base bid and the base bids with alternates for the new jail, which as discussed at the meeting last Thursday are both over what our bonding would cover. The board discussed using the General Basic carry over balance to finish paying for the project, which would not need to be done until early fall of 2026. The board plans to make their final decision on which bid to move forward with at their scheduled meeting on Thursday, February 13th.

The board also discussed the HVAC project and funding for the additional amount that is needed over the ARPA funds to complete the project. No action was taken on this.

Supervisor Benitz left the meeting at 9:30 a.m.

Conservation Director Tanner Scheuermann presented the FY26 Conservation Budget. Scheuermann shared a written narrative with the supervisors regarding various conservation related funds for both revenue and expenditures. Expenditure line items for part-time help would increase to \$28,160. Last year this line was reduced to have the ability to hire a new full-time Naturalist. He also would like to increase the starting wage for part-time positions to \$16.00 per hour. Scheuermann proposed decreases in the line items of fuel, dues & memberships, but proposed increases in several other line items. He reviewed land improvements at Squirrel Hollow Park and the Bike Trail. Overall expenditures for FY26 budget are \$736,909 which is an increase of \$8,799. No action was taken.

County Engineer Wade Weiss introduced ISAC Executive Director Andrea Woodward to the board and officials that were present at the meeting. Woodward reviewed services that ISAC provides for counties.

Next Sheriff Jack Williams presented the FY26 Entity Board (LEC) budget. The overall budget increased a total of \$1,500. The total requested amount for FY26 is \$104,500. No action was taken.

Auditor Billie Jo Hoskins presented the Medical Examiner budget for FY26. No change will be made to the budget, which totals \$27,000. No action was taken.

Hoskins then presented the Emergency Management budget for FY26. Increases were made to tort liability insurance and dues, which totals an increase of \$675.00 for a total budget of \$80,687. No action was taken.

The board then reviewed the Greene County Librarian's request that was presented in December of 2024. The librarians are asking for an 8% increase over last year's funding, which totals \$6,118.00. The total asking for FY26 is \$98,599, which includes \$10,000 that would be given to the Greene County Librarians Association for countywide projects. No action was taken.

Motion by Rudolph, second by Bardole to approve Resolution 2025-006 Resolution authorizing the transfer of \$30,854.00 from the ARPA Account fund to the General Basic fund for the payment of HVAC Engineering and Architectural Services.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TRANSFER OF \$30,854.00 FROM THE ARPA ACCOUNT FUND TO THE GENERAL BASIC FUND FOR THE PAYMENT OF HVAC ENGINEERING AND ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES

WHEREAS, on December 30, 2024, the Greene County Board of Supervisors executed a Memorandum of Understanding obligating \$1,761,652.32 in Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (the "SLFRF") to the Greene County Auditor (the "Auditor") for the purpose of replacing the HVAC system at the Greene County Courthouse as part of lost revenue replacement;

WHEREAS, under the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding, the Auditor agreed to coordinate the design of the Courthouse's new HVAC system, to cause to be prepared detailed plans and specifications and an engineer's cost estimate, to obtain all required permits and other things required for the proper construction of HVAC system, and to arrange contracting for the construction of the HVAC system;

WHEREAS, the Auditor further agreed to establish appropriate accounting systems to track and report on expenditures paid from the SLFRF and to maintain financial records to support all such expenditures;

WHEREAS, the Auditor established a separate ARPA Account Fund for the SLFRF received by the County; and

WHEREAS, BBS Architects | Engineers has submitted invoices totaling \$30,854.00 for engineering and architectural services related to the design and construction of the new HVAC system;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR GREENE COUNTY, IOWA:

Section 1: The Board hereby approves the transfer of \$30,854.00 from the ARPA Account Fund (0004) to the General Basic Fund (0001) for the payment of \$30,854.00 to BBS Architects | Engineers for HVAC engineering and architectural services provided to Greene County.
