Glimpses of the Past

May 19, 1905

Yesterday afternoon the college campus was the scene of a lively ball game. A mixed nine composed of college students and boys from town played the Wall Lake team. Mehl and Wilson were battery for Jewell and Anderson and Templer for Wall Lake. The result of the umpire's decision was Jewell 4, Wall Lake 1.

On Monday John Brinnick traded his restaurant to Otto Tieg of Eagle Grove for an eighty acre farm in Minnesota, and on Wednesday Mr. Tieg sold the business to M. A. Billings. The work of invoicing has been completed and Mr. Billings will open the doors to the public this afternoon. The new proprietor is a bright, energetic young man and we predict for him success in his new venture.

Richard Ryberg, an Ellsworth blacksmith, had a piece of glass about the size of a dime removed from his hand Monday by Dr. Martin. The glass became lodged in his hand on the 15th day of March, since which time he has been unable to use the hand. Under the X-ray Dr. Martin had no trouble in locating the glass which was taken out.

May 20, 1915

Last Friday morning Gilbert Knudson, president of the State Bank of Jewell, bought a controlling interest in the State Bank of Ellsworth. Mr. Knudson has bought the Brinton interest in the bank, 180 of the 350 shares of stock. This transaction is one more step toward bringing about a closer, more harmonious relation between Jewell and Ellsworth.

A. W. Knox has sold his shop, including lots, building and equipment, to Earl Riley who takes possession at once and will take charge of the shop in a couple of weeks. Ed Jansen will run the shop until Mr. Riley moves back to Jewell from Ames and will continue the general repair work and machine business at the shop and will also install equipment for the manufacture of his patent hog trough here.

Ole Tynning became owner of a 6 cylinder 7 passenger Chandler this week.

Mrs. J. A. Campbell came up from Ames Sunday morning and is spending the week at the Claude V. Campbell home, helping care for her little grandson. Mr. Campbell came up Tuesday evening and devoted a few hours between trains making the young man's acquaintance.

Randall Record: T. G. Pederson has bought a new Auburn car, so Tommy must take all the town girls for many rides now.

While hanging up a bunch of bananas at his restaurant Tuesday, M. J. Severson found a big tarantula in the bunch and has the insect on exhibition, confined in a glass jar.

May 21, 1925

Stanhope & Vicinity: Clarence O. Nelson and Jesse Wing left Saturday morning for Iowa City, where they visited until Monday with friends. Clarence visited his sister,, Miss Pearl Nelson, who is attending school at that place.

May 16, 1935

E. W. Knudson has closed a contract with the Iowa Highway Commission for the season of 1935 to August 14th to have charge of the sale of peat from the bed of Little Wall Lake south of Jewell.

Clarice Williams, a Stanhope contestant in the state commercial typing contest, has the distinction of being the only one to have a perfect paper, making no errors

Donald and Glen Gabrielson, Wendall Peterson and Willie Thorson skidded in a muddy rut on the Swenson hill north of Ellsworth and crashed into the ditch when they were driving home in the Gabrielson car. Thorson suffered a cut on the foot and a back injury and was taken to the hospital. Peterson had cuts and body bruises. The Gabrielson boys escaped with minor injuries.

Gene, 9 year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Thompson of southeast of Ellsworth, was very severely injured Tuesday. He was playing on a wagon, accidentally struck his face against the end of an endgate rod. His nose was fractured in several places and the partition of the nose cut, besides other cuts on the face.

May 17, 1945

Dr. and Mrs. F. G. Vernon of Jewell announce the marriage of their daughter, Frances, to Robert E. Mc-Guire on February 7th at Los Angeles, California.

Emma Schaa started work last week as night waitress at the O'Connor cafe.

May 19, 1955

Faye Vespested was hostess at a bridal shower for Mary Ann Hage on Saturday, May 7, at her home in Jewell. Guests included the girls of the class of 1950. May 20, 1965

Mary Ann May of Jewell and Ricki Darle Engelby of Stratford were united in marriage in a double ring

Barbara, May 20, 1975

The Jewellette League at South Hamilton Community Lanes ended the season with a dinner and award presentation last week.

May 22, 1975

Construction of a new fertilizer plant at the Central Iowa Cooperative in Jewell is well underway, The new cooperative was formed as the result of a merger between the Jewell and Stanhope cooperatives, and at the same time an ambitious building program was undertaken.

May 16, 1985

May 18, 1995

The lawn of the week winner will be recognized by the placement of a sign in their yard if they so desire.

May 18, 2005

Forty-two 5th graders from South Hamilton Schools participated in Youth Environment Ag Days, sponsored by ISU Extension at the Wright County Fairgrounds on May 9th. Each 5th grader, teacher and adult volunteer participated in seventeen 25-minute educational programs including sun safety, water stewardship, forestry, animal by-products, corn and soybean by-products, biotechnology and the food production cycle.
