NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR APPROVAL OF DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT BETWEEN LAKE MILLS CHAMBER DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION AND THE CITY OF LAKE MILLS
The City Council of the City of Lake Mills, Iowa, will meet at the Council Chambers in City Hall, 200 N 1st Avenue West on the **19th day of May, 2025, at 7:00 o'clock p.m.**, at which time and place proceedings will be instituted and action taken to approve a Development Agreement between the City and Lake Mills Chamber Development Corporation with respect to the promotion and support of economic development in the Lake Mills Urban Renewal Area, which provides for certain property tax incentives in the form of annual appropriation property tax payments of \$56,000 increasing by 1% each year for a period of five years, as authorized by Section¶403.9 of the Code of Iowa.
The City's agreement to make incremental property tax payments will not be a general obligation of the City but will be payable solely and only from incremental property tax revenues generated within the Lake Mills Urban Renewal Area. All payments to be made by the City under the Agreement will be subject to annual appropriation of the City Council.
At the meeting, the Council will receive oral or written objections from any resident or property owner of the City. Thereafter, the Council may, at the meeting or at an adjournment thereof, take additional action to approve the Development Agreement or may abandon the proposal.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SOURCE WATER ASSESSMENT INFORMATION

This water supply obtains its water from the dolomite and limestone of the Devonian-Ordovician (abv St. Peter) aquifer. The Devonian-Ordovician (abv St. Peter) aquifer was determined to have low susceptibility to contamination because the characteristics of the aquifer and overlying materials provide natural protection from contaminants at the land surface. The Devonian-Ordovician (abv St. Peter) wells will have low susceptibility to most surface contaminant sources such as leaking underground storage tanks, contaminant spills, and excess fertilizer application.
