June has been filled with all things Summer Reading Program. It's so fun to visit the LMCS classrooms in May to talk about the program and all the fun events we have scheduled for the summer. But, it's even more fun watching some of those kids walk in our doors to act upon their excitement and actually register for the program.

We've had over 160 kids register during our sign-up and have already had some bookmarks returned and prizes claimed. For each 30 minutes read, the kids mark off one circle on their bookmark. They can turn their bookmarks in after completing eight, 16, or 24 circles—depending on the tiered level of prize they are working towards. Four, eight, or 12 hours of reading . . . and then start all over again. It's a "win-win" for everyone—participants, families, and teachers hoping kids avoid the infamous "summer slide." Oh, and did I mention, it's great for all of us at the Lake Mills Public Library as well.

Our young adult readers, ages 12-18, simply check out a book, read/respond on their bookmark, and turn it in for a drawing every Friday at 2 p.m. for \$10 in Lake Mills bucks and/or LM theater passes. All of this, as well as some awesome weekly events and in-library challenges, are going to make for an incredible summer of reading. Stop in and pick up a calendar of events or follow us on Facebook, Channel 2 and KIOW.

The reading challenges and prizes are for the kids, but the events are open to ALL. Come and join us. We'd love to see you here at the library.
