





David Hicks, Director of YSS Marshall County, provided the MPACT Quarterly Update. From January through May, advocates responded to 82 calls for service, involving 164 people, with 30% of them, being upder 18 years of them being under 18 years of age. Of the calls, 30% were for homelessness, 20% for mental health, and 20% for family conflict. 82% of the responding off-icers on the initial call went back into service. 98% of the callers who requested services followed through with program recommendations. Program donors were able to provide 19 nights of hotel

stays for 14 people and 1 dog. There were 230 follow-up_contacts, involving 350 people. David shared a FLOCK camera success story, locating a gentleman with dementia who was lost, and the advocate was able to assist the family. Staff members attended the National Co-Responder Conference and were able to present on the program. Chief Jones presented the 2024 Marshalltown Police Department Annual Report, not-

ing FLOCK cameras have been very successful. There is a focus on officer wellness, recruitment, and building community relations. Calls for service have been consistent with staff training on how to handle calls quickly.
