Marshalltown Water Works will issue a sales tax exemption certificate to the Contractor for all material purchased for incorporation into the project. Tax exemption certificates are applicable only for the specific project for which the tax exemption certificate is issued. Completion of Work

The Contractor shall fully complete the overall project no later than November 14, 2027. Full completion for the overall project shall be defined as all work including punch list items completed, and all improvements ready for final acceptance. Should the Contractor fail to fully complete the work in this timeframe, liquidated damages of two thousand, four hundred Dollars (\$2,400.00) per calendar day will be assessed for work not fully completed within the designated Contract term(s).


