Pursuant to the requirements of Section 20.7 of the Osceola County Zoning Ordinance, the Board of Adjustment will conduct a public hearing on January 8, 2025, at 1:30 p.m. in the Board of Supervisors room at the Osceola County Courthouse, 300 7th Street, Sibley, Iowa 51249. Cooperative Elevator Association as applicant has requested a front yard setback variance from the requirement of Osceola County's Zoning Ordinance Sections 5.6 and 11.5. Site Development Regulations, of 25' when 50' is required. The property's commonly known address is 823 Main Street, Ocheyedon, Iowa and is owned by Cooperative Elevator Association. A brief legal description of the property is Tract 1: 8.31 acre TR NE 1/4 SE 1/4 and Tract 2: NE 1/4 SE 1/4 partial parcel H. Property has parcel ID # 310180241030 and 220070241020 and is within Sec/Twp/Rng. 2-99-40. The parcels are zoned (GI) General Industrial and (AG) Agricultural.

The purpose of the hearing is to hear and review a request for a variance from the requirement of Osceola County Zoning Ordinance, Site Development Regulations, Sections 5.6 and 11.5, which requires a 50' front yard setback from the right-of-way line (property line) of Tyler Avenue for property zoned GI-General Industrial and AG-Agricultural. The applicant proposes to construct a solar array for their business and is requesting a 25' front yard setback for this solar array.
