ORDINANCE NO. 535

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES THE CITY OF ONAWA, IOWA BY **AMENDING** CHAPTER 136 PERTAINING TO SIDEWALK REGULATIONS

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ONAWA

SECTION 1. <u>SECTION AMENDED</u>. Section 136.18 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Onawa, lowa, is hereby repealed in its entirety and the following adopted in lieu thereof:

136.18 MERCHANDISE DIS-PLAY. It is unlawful for a person to place upon or above any sidewalk, any goods or merchandise for sale or display in such a manner as to interfere with the free and uninterrupted passage of pedestrians on the sidewalk; ex-

cept as otherwise provided in this Chapter, in no case shall more than three (3) feet of the sidewalk next to a building be occupied for such purposes.

SECTION 2. <u>SECTION ADDED.</u> A new section, 136.21, titled "Sidewalk Use in Central Business Commercial District" is hereby added to read as follows:

136.21 SIDEWALK USE IN CENTRAL BUSINESS COM-MERCIAL DISTRICT. A business or property immediately adjacent to a sidewalk within the BC zoning district, may annually apply for and receive a permit to use a portion of the adjacent sidewalk from the building edge to the edge of the bricked sidewalk nearest to the building for commercial or other nonpublic use. The City Council shall consider the impact of the proposed use upon public property, public investments, public rights of access, and to business owners property owners, and residents in granting permission for allowing the requested use and reserves its right as the steward of public right-of-way to limit, prohibit, or place conditions on the nonpublic uses of the public right-of-way.
The City Council shall also consider whether an applicant has previously had a sidewalk use permit terminated, suspended, or revoked, in determining whether to approve a permit. Such annual permit is subject to the following additional requirements and con-

(a) Payment of an annual fee, as annually set by the City Council

(b) The City may terminate the permit for violation of any material terms or conditions of the permit, or due to violation of any city ordinances or state statutes or regulations

(c) The application must include a drawing showing the layout of any objects, such as tables and chairs, which the applicant intends to place on the sidewalk, and no objects may prevent pedestrian traffic or encroach on another business's property

(d) All objects placed on the sidewalk pursuant to the permit may be placed no earlier than April 1 and must be removed by November 1 each year, unless otherwise authorized by the City Council;

(e) Applicant must sign a statement holding the City harmless and indemnifying the City, its of-ficers and employees, for any claims for damages to property or injury to persons which may occur in connection with any activity carried on pursuant to the permit; and applicant must furnish and maintain a policy of insurance protecting the applicant and the City from all claims for damage to property or bodily injury, including death, which may arise from operations in the permitted area;

(f) Applicant must maintain the sidewalk area in a clean manner and must provide appropriate trash receptacles for use within the permit area;

(g) Alcohol service in the permit area is prohibited unless the adjacent business holds a valid onsale license issued by the state, and any sale or consumption is limited to the area identified in the permit;

(h) The Mayor, or any city official designated by the City Council, may revoke or suspend a permit upon finding that any provision herein or condition set forth in the permit has been violated by written notice to the permit holder prior to the revocation or suspension. A permit may be reinstated by the Mayor or designee after all violations have, in the discretion of the Mayor or designee. been cured. A permit holder may request review of the Mayor or designee's decision by a written request with the City Council, which shall be heard by the Council at its next regularly scheduled meeting, the request is received at least 72 hours in advance of the next scheduled meeting.

SECTION 3. <u>REPEALER</u>. The remainder of Chapter 147 shall remain the same. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION4. <u>SEVERABILITYCLAUSE</u>. If any section, provision or part of this ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof, not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

SECTION 5. WHEN EFFECTIVE. This ordinance shall be in effect from and after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.


