North Korea's newest warship was severely damaged during a launch ceremony Wednesday, May 21, with leader Kim Jong Un, who witnessed the accident, saying it brought shame to the nation's prestige and vowing to punish those found responsible, state media reported.

In a rare admission of failure, the official Korean Central News Agency (KCNA) said a malfunction in the launch mechanism caused the stern of the as-yet unnamed 5,000-ton destroyer to slide prematurely into the water, crushing parts of the hull and leaving the bow stranded on the shipway.

Kim called the launch failure "a criminal act" and blamed it on "absolute carelessness" and "irresponsibility" by multiple state institutions - including the Munitions Industry Department, Kim Chaek University of Technology and the central ship design bureau.

According to a South Korean military analysis, the vessel is lying on its side in the water, Joint Chiefs of Staff (JCS) spokesperson Lee Sung-joon said during a press briefing.

Naval analyst Carl Schuster in Hawaii, after reviewing the KCNA account, said he thinks the stresses would "warp the hull, induce cracks and (possibly) snap the keel depending on where the greatest stress falls."

The launch failure marks a setback for what analysts have viewed as North Korea's most ambitious naval modernization effort in decades.

The ship was to be the second major navy surface vessel revealed in quick succession by North Korea. In April, Kim unveiled the Choe Hyon, the country's first newly constructed destroyer in decades, and declared his ambition of building more destroyers and various cruisers and frigates.

Kim ordered the destroyer to be restored before the

Two female US Secret Service Uniformed Division officers got into a physical fight outside of Barack Obama's DC residence at 2:30 am on Wednesday, May 21.

According to RealClearPolitics: Two female Secret Service Uniformed Division officers got into a physical fight outside former President Obama's D.C. residence while guarding it. The fracas occurred at roughly 2:30 a.m. early Wednesday morning, according to two sources in the Secret Service community.

The lack of professionalism was on display during the fight and in a call one of the women made on a recorded Secret Service line to request a supervisor to come to the scene "immediately before I whoop this girl's ass." The woman officer who made the call was upset that her shift replacement was late and assailed her verbally and physically when she finally did arrive to relieve her. Audio of the early a.m. call is now circulating among agents and officers.

It's unclear whether either woman was injured or whether they will be disciplined over the altercation. The fight did not wake anyone in the Obama residence or the surrounding neighborhood, the sources said.

A former priest was convicted and sentenced to two months in prison, suspended for three years, for insulting President Andrzej Duda, Prime Minister Donald Tusk, and Speaker of the Sejm Szymon Hołownia in Baranów at the end of February 2024. He also insulted Duda on another occasion in December 2023.

The District Court in Poznań stated, according to wPolityce, that the accused "used words commonly considered offensive to describe the indicated persons during a sermon." He will be supervised by a probation officer for his three years of suspension. However, the judgment is not final, meaning the former priest can appeal.

Judge Karolina Siwierska stated that despite being excommunicated by Pope Francis, the former Salesian leads a religious community where he celebrates "masses" and delivers sermons touching on the political and social situation in the country. These sermons are published on a website.

The judge's ruling noted his sermon from December 2023, in which the accused called Duda "a buffoon," "a scoundrel," "a Pharisee," and "a stinker." In February 2024, he called both Duda and Tusk "traitors" and "scum," while labeling Hołownia "a wimp."

"These terms do not fall within the limits of permissible criticism," the judge said, calling them "clearly offensive and contemptuous in nature."

"It is not that freedom of speech is unlimited and that you can say whatever you want and wherever you want, because words have a lot of power. Words can hurt, mislead people. Words can also encourage evil, to commit crimes. That is why words must be weighed, used carefully and be responsible for them. Meanwhile, the accused has already been punished five times for his statements in which he humiliated, insulted, insulted and defamed other people. His sermons are filled with aggression, hate and so-called hate speech. And if God is love, then there was no God in the accused's sermons. And I say this with regret and great sadness," her judgment read.
