

More Than 20 Arrested In NYC As Mob Tries To Block Feds From Conducting Immigration Raids

More than 20 people were arrested Saturday as a mob of nearly 150 protesters cursed at cops and tried to block federal authorities from conducting immigration raids in Lower Manhattan, according to a police source, federal officials and video from the chaotic scene. The angry, masked demonstrators yelled "motherf--kers" at officers, sat in the roadway, threw objects and even themselves in front of an unmarked white van with tinted windows as it tried to leave 26 Federal Plaza, where the U.S. Immigration Court is housed. "Back up, back up!" six uniformed Department of Homeland Security officers yelled while shoving the agitators aside, footage of the incident showed.

Patel Promises FBI Coming For Anyone Assaulting Cops As Los Angeles Erupts Over ICE Raids

Following violent anti-ICE riots in Los Angeles on Saturday night, FBI Director Kash Patel warned "if you assault a law enforcement officer, you're going to jail--period." "It doesn't matter where you came from, how you got here, or what cause you claim to represent," Patel told Fox News Digital. "If local jurisdictions won't stand behind the men and women who wear the badge, the FBI will." President Donald Trump signed a Presidential Memorandum deploying 2,000 National Guardsmen to Paramount, California, after immigration authorities driving in the area were pelted with rocks, stones, and concrete -- shattering government vehicle windshields. U.S. Border Patrol Chief Michael W. Banks shared a photo of one Border Patrol agent's bloody hand, which was injured by a rock flying through the windshield.

Guard, Active Duty Marines 'On High Alert'

Defense Secretary Pete Hegseth said Saturday that the Pentagon is mobilizing the National Guard to respond to anti-ICE protests in California and warned that active duty Marines at Camp Pendleton may be deployed as well "if violence continues." "The violent mob assaults on ICE and Federal Law Enforcement are designed to prevent the removal of Criminal Illegal Aliens from our soil; a dangerous invasion facilitated by criminal cartels and a huge NATIONAL SECURITY RISK," Hegseth wrote on X. "The @DepotDefense is mobilizing the National Guard IMMEDIATELY to support federal law enforcement in Los Angeles," he wrote. "And, if violence continues, active duty Marines at Camp Pendleton will also be mobilized -- they are on high alert."

U.S. Issues Security Alert For Kiev

The U.S. embassy in Kiev has advised Americans to heed air-raid sirens and shelter appropriately, warning of "a continued risk of significant air attacks," in a new security alert issued on Wednesday. Russian President Vladimir Putin "did say, and very strongly, that he will have to respond" to recent Ukrainian attacks on airfields hosting Russian strategic bombers, U.S. President Donald Trump wrote on Truth Social on Wednesday evening, revealing details of their unannounced conversation that day. The U.S. State Department issued the security alert just hours earlier, advising Americans currently in Ukraine to "identify shelter locations in advance" and to "keep reserves of water, food, and medication."

UK Must Prepare For Direct Conflict With Russia - Defense Secretary

The UK plans to mobilize billions of pounds to bolster its military-industrial base in preparation for a potential conflict with Russia, Defense Secretary John Healey has said. The statement comes ahead of the publication of the government's Strategic Defense Review on Monday. According to the BBC, the report is expected to portray Russia and China as major threats to the UK. The review is expected to allocate

1.5 billion pounds (\$2 billion) toward building six new munitions factories. Over the next five years, London will dedicate around 6 billion pounds (\$8.08 billion) to manufacturing long-range weapons, including Storm Shadow missiles, Healey told the BBC on Sunday. The missile, developed jointly with France, has reportedly been used by Ukraine to strike civilian targets in Russian territory, according to Moscow.

Ukrainian Drones Damage Hospital, Homes In Russia's Kursk, Official Says

Ukrainian drones launched a night-time attack on Russia's western Kursk region, damaging a hospital and apartment buildings and injuring at least one person, the regional governor said early on Friday... Russian President Vladimir Putin has said he wants to create a buffer zone in Sumy, which was used to help launch Ukraine's incursion into Kursk last year. In the Kursk region, where Russia's military says Ukrainian forces who staged the incursion last August have been ejected, Governor Alexander Khinshtein said Ukrainian drones swarmed the main town, also called Kursk.
