

Osceola to see revenues decrease in Fiscal Year 2025-26

With budget hearings for Fiscal Year 2025-26 coming to an end, the city of Osceola will hold theirs at 7 p.m. Tuesday, April 29 at Osceola City Hall. Total revenues for the

city in FY25-26 are budgeted at \$17,295,104, just under \$7.6 million less than the re-estimated FY24-25's amount \$24,864,453. Taxes levied on properties will have an increase just shy of \$66,000, from \$2,933,574 in re-estimated FY24-25 to a budgeted amount of \$2,999,517 in FY25-26. Increases will also be seen in charges for fees and services, budgeted at \$8,139,801 in the coming year up from \$3,936,301 the year prior; FY23-24 had \$8,559,168 in revenues in this category. Miscellaneous revenues are also budgeted to increase to \$413,002 from \$240,000.

The largest revenue

decreases are intergovernmental and other financing sources. In the re-estimated FY24-25, intergovernmental revenues came in at \$5,336,102, while FY25-26 is budgeted at \$270,613. Other financing sources are budgeted at \$0 for the coming fiscal year, and totaled \$6,800,000 in re-estimated FY24-25.

Total expenditures for the city are budgeted at \$16,527,895, a slight increase from \$16,354,457 in re-estimated FY24-25. Including transfers out, the total for all expenditures is a budgeted \$18,331,164 for FY25-26. In FY24-25, that amount was \$18,352,742.

Across the different expenditures, decreases are seen ranging from \$20,500 to just over \$1.9 million. Total government activities have a decrease to \$9,147,895 down from FY24-25's \$11,081,936. Public works have the largest decrease of just under \$1.2 million, budgeted for FY25-26 at

\$577,902 from re-estimated \$1,758,370 in FY24-25. A budgeted \$1,551,900 for public safety is down from \$1,811,685 in FY24-25's re-estimated budget.

An increase in business type/enterprises expenditures is budgeted at \$7,380,000 in FY25-26, up from \$\$5,272,521in re-estimated FY24-25. Debt service has an increase from \$1,882,440 in re-estimated FY24-25 to budgeted \$2,074,278 in FY25-26. The beginning fund balance for July 1, 2025 is budgeted at \$14,665,909 with an ending fund balance on June 30, 2026 at \$13,629,849.

The city held their proposed tax levy hearing on April 1, with the estimated total tax levy rate per \$1,000 valuation on regular property at 14.77699. For agricultural properties, which make up a small percentage of the city's taxable properties, that levy was proposed at 3.00375.
