Due to a misunderstanding with two grants that were written for the Senior Center, a restroom update and dining room update, we are needing to pay the invoices for the finished restroom. The restroom grant was NOT awarded and the dining room grant WAS awarded. The grant administrators got them mixed around. Council has agreed to support the grant so we'll just need to pay for this one and not pay as much for the dining room as that one will have grant funds coming for reimbursement. There are reserves available to pay for the restroom update. Motion by Thiner seconded by Myers to approve paying the expenses, totaling \$6,561.68 for the restroom update. All voted Aye: Myers, Stone, Pedley, Thiner and Ackerman. Nay: none.

Staff was given the option to use the old conference room chairs in their breakrooms and have declined. The cloth chairs are problematic due to collecting dirt, grim or anything that may have gotten on clothing. They will
