**DEAR FAULTED:** I

am sorry for your pain. You may be able to get the help you need by contacting your county health department and asking about low-cost counseling services, or by reaching out to the nearest college or university that has a department of psychology and asking if any of their graduate students could see you (under supervision). I cannot fix your family - no one can. But that doesn't mean you can't strengthen yourself, which is what you may need to do in order to stop hurting and find your indignation.
