The United States District Court for the Northern District of Iowa announced Wednesday Dana Eugene Igou, 41, was sentenced after pleading guilty in January to "one count of possession

of firearms by a drug user and domestic abuse misdemeanant and one count ing north in I-29 at a high rate of conspiracy to distribute the Igou, according to the court, possessed several firearms during the course of a conspiracy to distribute at least 500 grams of methamphetamine. In December 2023, he was stopped for a traffic violation and authorities found a 9 millimeter handgun as well as a "small amount of methamphetamine." "Igou was prohibited from possessing firearms because of his prior felony convictions and his prior conviction of a crime of domestic violence," the court stated. The following spring, in The bridge will remain March 2024, Igou was arrested again and was found at that time with firearms, ammo, brass knuckles and close to nine ounces of meth. United States District Court Judge Leonard T. Strand sentenced Igou and in addition to a 170-month imprisonment he must serve a five-year term of supervised release after the prison term, according to the court.
