The kingdom of God

The phrases "kingdom of God" and "kingdom of heaven" often appear in the Gospels. John the Baptist announced it. Jesus proclaimed and gave many parables about it. The disciples were sent to preach it. It was central to His message and mission. But what exactly is the kingdom of God?

Jesus wasn't teaching about a crucified, risen and ascended Savior — because that hadn't occurred yet. So what was He teaching, and what does He expect His followers, even those

who come after His ascension, to teach now? At its core, the kingdom of God is the rule and reign of God — both in the present and in the future. It is not merely a place, but a reality, wherever God's authority is embraced and His will is done.

In Jewish thought, the kingdom was expected to be a future, national and political theocracy when the Messiah would overthrow Israel's enemies and establish God's rule from Jerusalem (see Isaiah 9:6-7; Daniel 2:44; Zechariah 14). So when Jesus declared, "The Kingdom of God is at hand" (Mark 1:15), it would have sparked intense hope and expectation.

Yet Jesus reframed that idea. The kingdom was already breaking in, though not yet in its final

form. It came not through the power of politics or force, but through the power of faith and re-

Jesus did not yet preach a crucified and risen Messiah — His disciples themselves didn't understand that until after the resurrection (Luke 18:34). But He did teach the values and nature of God's kingdom:

It had already arrived in His ministry: "If I cast out demons by the finger of God, surely the Kingdom of God has come upon you" (Luke 11:20).

It starts small but grows: The parables of the mustard seed and the leaven (Matt. 13) show its quiet, transformative power.

It flips worldly values: The Beatitudes (Matt. 5) place blessing on the poor, meek, and merciful those typically overlooked.

It demands repentance and allegiance: "Repent, for the Kingdom of heaven is at hand" (Matt. 4:17).

It is both now and not yet: Jesus said the kingdom is "among you" (Luke 17:21), but also spoke of a coming fullness (Luke 22:18).

When Jesus sent out the 12 and then the seventy, He told them to:

"Preach the Kingdom of God." (Luke 9:2) "Heal the sick there, and say to them, 'The Kingdom of God has come near to you." (Luke 10:9)

They weren't just preaching personal salvation, but proclaiming that God's reign was breaking into the world. The kingdom of God resembles

creation before the fall — no sickness, no curse, no death and God dwelling with His people. Jesus' kingdom message wasn't theory; it came with power — manifested in healing, deliverance, and authority over sin and darkness.

After the resurrection, Jesus continued teaching about the kingdom (Acts 1:3), but now everything had changed. The King had conquered Satan, and more fundamentally, the true enslaving power of this world: sin, which rules even over Satan. The reign of God was no longer just near — it had begun through Christ's finished work.

With the King enthroned, the apostles now preached, "Jesus is Lord" (Acts 2:36), and called people to turn from darkness to light, from selfrule to God-rule (Colossians 1:13). The kingdom was still the message — but now fully revealed.

Sadly, much of modern Christianity has shifted the emphasis away from the kingdom of God. Instead of calling people to surrender to God's rule, many churches focus on gaining members, promoting programs, or simply inviting people to attend a service.

But Jesus didn't come to start a religious organization — He came to announce the reign of God and invite people into it.

We are still called to proclaim the kingdom not merely "join the church," but enter the reign of God through faith in Jesus the King.

We proclaim the King: Jesus, crucified and risen.

We call for repentance: A turning from sin and self to Jesus' lordship.

We demonstrate the kingdom: Through lives transformed by the Spirit.

We invite others in: Not by works, but by grace

We anticipate the return: When Jesus will fully

establish His visible reign (Revelation 11:15). In Jesus, the kingdom has begun to break in — it is not just a future hope; it is a present reality for those who follow the King. Even now, we're

called to live in and extend His kingdom as His

Jesus makes available healing, deliverance, and spiritual authority to those who walk in obedience and dependence on the King. We're not just to wait for the kingdom — we're to live in it and represent it with the same power and authority Jesus gave His followers.

The kingdom is the heart of Jesus' message not a distant dream, but a reality we are called to live in now. It's not merely about personal salvation, but total surrender to Christ's reign. Yes, the kingdom demands everything, but promises more than we can imagine. By proclaiming it, we cultivate a hunger for it and are moved to crucify ourselves daily in order to live under His rule.

"But seek first the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you" — Matthew 6:33.
