Crop Walk Series to Offer Scouting and Soil Fertility **Tips**

Three unique sessions from ISU Extension and Outreach provide timely insights for crop producers

AMES, Iowa - Iowa State University Extension and Outreach is hosting a handson Crop Walk series, providing mid-summer, late-season and pre-harvest tips for crop producers.

Three practical sessions offered during the growing season will share timely crop, disease and insect scouting information, as well as soil sampling and fertility insights to help producers with yearround decision-making.

Meaghan Anderson, field agronomist with ISU Extension and Outreach, said the sessions will allow producers to observe and discuss local issues they may find in their own fields.

"This Crop Walk series aims to improve scouting skills and help participants understand the use of integrated pest management in making management decisions for crop weeds, diseases and insects," she said.

A regular City Council meeting was held May 14, 2025 at the City Hall Chambers.
Present were Mayor Protem Paul Gettler, who called the meeting to order at 6:33 pm, City Attorney Clint Fichter, City Supervisor Ryan Billheimer, City Clerk Lorene Grubbs and council persons, Shannon Haus, Jade Irlmeier, Renee Jensen by phone, Rick Stanley showed at 6:58pm. Absent Mayor Joanne Byars.

Pledge of Allegiance was said. Approval of agenda made by Irlmeier and second by Haus, all ayes motion carried. Approval of Consent Agenda including Council Minutes (4/9/25), claims and payroll, financials, and licenses. Motion to approve the consent agenda made by Irlmeier and second by Haus. All ayes, motion carried.

Little Smiles & Company board member Danielle Drees spoke on the daycare's completed projects. A data survey study starting June 1 will be paid by the city so results can be used by the city as well. Motion to approve a \$10,000 economic development grant payment to Little Smiles & Company was made by Irlmeier and second by Haus, all ayes, motion carried.

Rozanne Hughes on 6th St. & Cass St. water drainage was discussed earlier in the day and Billheimer has a plan in place to fix the problem. Rozanne requested the council review the ordinance for fireworks with request to keep big commercial ones out of the city.

Tracey & Heather Watson 500 6th St. nuisance served has a delay enforcement with

the cleanup in rocess and tabled until June. Outdated front desk computer will be replaced for \$957. Motion by Haus to approve

the purchase and second by Gettler, all ayes, motion carried. Ordinance 2025-01 for water rate increase. Minimum Fee (1 to 2,000 gallons) \$38 flat fee. 2,000 to 6,000 gallons \$8.00 per thousand gallons, 6,000 to 10,000 gallons \$12.00 per thousand gallons, over 10,000 gallons \$16.00 per thousand gallons effective June 1 for

approval by Irlmeier and second by Haus. Third reading is waived. Roll call all ayes, motion carried. $Resolution\,25\text{-}0514\text{-}01\,to\,remove\,street\,lights\,for\,2025\,Audubon\,Street\,Reconstruction\,2011\,Resolution\,2$

project was approved. Motioned to approve made by Stanley and second by Irlmeier, roll call all ayes, motion carried. Audubon Street Flag Poles are being repurposed and will replace old poles at the

Sunny Hill Cemetery south of Adair. Motion made by Irlmeier and second by Haus. All ayes, motion carried. Amendment to Owner-Engineer Agreement on water plant for Snyder's engineering feeson closing up the water project was approved contingent on if the USDA will reimburse the city. We have submitted all the bills and also have held back \$50,000 in retainage.

Motion made by Irlmeier and second by Stanley, all ayes, motion carried.

Public Hearing on FY 25 Budget Amendment Notice motion to open by Stanley at 7:12 pm and second by Haus, roll call all ayes, motion carried. No public comments. Stanley made a motion to close the public hearing at 7:12 pm and second by Haus. Roll call all

ayes, motion carried. Resolution 25-0514-02 Approving FY 25 Budget Amendment with adjustments due to liability insurance, street maintenance project, water area with operation changes and new debt coming in. Motioned made by Irlmeier and second by Stanley, roll call all ayes,

Casey's store sale to a minor violation will be prosecuted by the state and not the city after learning the cost estimate over \$200 and the city would receive 80% of the fine if we

prosecuted. Motion by Stanley and second by Jensen, all ayes, motion carried. Helena Chemical's water bill has been incorrect after a meter replacement around July 2017. The multiplier was not changed from 100's to 1000's in gWorks and March 2018-April 2020 were never billed. Motion was made by Irlmeier and second by Haus to send a bill

for \$15,564.00 to correct the 100's to 1000's reading with 26 months of free water not billed. All ayes, motion carried Sidewalk removal at 909 Guthrie Street is contingent on other neighbors willing to have their sidewalk removed. The sidewalk that doesn't go anywhere is in disrepair and is a liability. Motion to approve made by Haus and second by Gettler, all ayes, motion carried. Crawford Addition Incentives will remain at \$18,500. Approval made by Irlmeier and

second by Stanley, all ayes, motion carried. Rental Inspections have an International Property Maintenance Code that could be implemented. Fichter will bring us examples and the discussion was tabled.

Motion to go into closed session pursuant to Iowa Code 21.5(i) at 8:20pm made by Haus and second by Gettler, all ayes motion carried. Motion to exit closed session at 8:42pm

Irlmeier motioned and Haus second, all ayes, motion carried to extend the meeting an additional hour.

Employee Reports: Officer Wulf read the months activity and gave a repair update on the police vehicle. Reimbursement for miles on Wulf's personal vehicle will be looked into and further discussion is needed on updating bodycam and Toughbook equipment
