BOARD OF SUPERVISORS March 25th, 2025

The special Public Hearing meeting of the Board of Supervisors was called to order at 1:03 pm by Chairman Heath Hansen. Present at the meeting were Heath Hansen, Kent Grabill, Don Mosinski, Lisa Frederiksen, Chassity Musfeldt, Juanita Reynard, Alka Swanson, Dean Bauer, Michael Bauer, Randy Lange, Lora Anthofer, Jerad Coder, Mike Blum, Duane Deist, and Danny Wittrock.

Motion- Grabill Second- Mosinski to approve agenda. Vote-all in favor. The Public Hearing for the FY26 Proposed Property Tax Levy was opened. Chairman Hansen started the meeting by explaining to the Taxpayers that the County is working to get the debts paid off/down. All major projects are being halted. Various departments are meeting with Supervisors to eliminate any excess out of their budgets. Taxpayers inquired about the TIF funds from the Wind Turbines. Auditor Frederiksen explained that the County has four different bonds that are being used for Secondary Roads/Conservation projects, and the TIF funds are used to pay the principal and interest on those bonds. Taxpayers voiced concerns on the Courthouse HVAC system costs. It was discussed again that the County needs to stop spending money on major projects with such a large deficit. Taxpayers proposed the idea of cutting back some of the fulltime positions/sharing between offices to help the budget. Other concerns from taxpayers included the costs of the Conservation cabin project, the State of Iowa not helping with the costs of the E911 tower, snow removal, gravel application, and tax increases. It was suggested by taxpayers that if any major projects/decisions are proposed in the future, that a notice is put out to the Public to ask for opinions. Meeting was adjourned at 3:00 pm.
