SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the USDA, Rural Development - Rural Business Service (RBS), as required by the National Environmental Policy Act, is issuing an environmental assessment (EA) in connection with possible impacts related to a project proposed by Natural Fertilizer Products, Inc. of Woodbine, IA. The proposal is for construction of the Western Iowa Nutrient Recycling Center in Audubon County, Iowa. The project is located southeast of Audubon, in Audubon County, Iowa, at 1351 Heron Avenue, Audubon. Natural Fertilizer Products, Inc. has submitted an application to USDA Rural Development RBS for funding of the proposal.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: Natural Fertilizer Products, Inc. proposes to construct the Western Iowa Nutrient Recycling Center, in Audubon County, Iowa, southeast of the Audubon, in Rural Audubon. The project includes the acquisition of approximately 28.25 acres of land and the construction of: four 80'x180' compost buildings, one 50'x150' commodities building, one 50'x50' climate controlled de-packaging building, one 75'x266' concrete mixing pad, 5 acres of compacted clay compost pads, one 25'x40'x8' liquid pit, one 60'x80' shop, one 15'x80' truck scale, 4,500 square feet/1 acre of gravel driveways, and fencing/gates for the site. Land was previously used as a swine facility for row crop production. This facility is designed to recycle organic waste, primarily food processing waste, livestock mortality and livestock manure, into high-quality compost. The compost produced will serve as a sustainable alternative to synthetic fertilizers, improving soil health while significantly reducing methane emissions from landfills. This project supports regional waste management goals and enhances local agricultural productivity, providing farmers with a renewable source of fertilizer while minimizing environmental impact. This project is one of two large-scale composting facilities that Natural Fertilizer Products, Inc. has proposed. Off-site facilities connected to this project will be acquired and constructed in Harrison County, and a separate Environmental Assessment has been completed for that portion of the project.


Rebecca Castle Laughlin, independent consultant, and Abe Sandquist, Natural Fertilizer Products, Inc., prepared an environmental assessment for USDA RD RBS that describes the project, assesses the proposed project's environmental impacts, and summarizes as applicable any mitigation measures used to minimize environmental effects. USDA RD RBS has conducted an

independent evaluation of the environmental assessment and believes that it accurately assesses the impacts of the proposed project. No significant impacts are expected as a result of the construction of the project.

Ouestions and comments should be sent to USDARD RBS at the address provided. USDA RD RBS will accept questions and comments on the environmental assessment for 14 days from the date of publication of this notice.
