70 Years Ago

April 1955

The hope of years was answered on Tuesday of this week when it was announced officially that the Salk vaccine had been found to be effective in preventing polio.

The disease, which has taken the lives of so many and left others in a crippled condition, can now be relegated to the same class as diphtheria, small pox, etc., which in yester years, before a preventative was discovered, took their terrific toll.

For parents it is a special relief because the fear of having their children stricken with the disease will be gone as soon as the vaccine becomes available and protection can be obtained through vaccination.

It is a memorable event and of two fold benefit. One, the prevention of polio and the other, the probability that in due time, science also will find preventatives of cancer and other dreaded diseases.

According to statistics, excessive speed was the most dangerous driving mistake in 1954 and as a result 12,380 people were killed and 659,000 were injured in our national accident toll.

In spite of this fact, there's no speed limit here in Iowa. A way has been found to set the number of fish that can be caught, the number of ducks that can be shot, and how to deal with intoxicated drivers but getting a speed limit appears to be an insurmountable problem. Hard to figure out why

1945 Coal Rationing Program.

1. You must get a declaration from your coal dealer stating how much you purchased since April 1, 1944. They are here now. Come in ad sign up as soon as possible.

2. If you used less than 25 tons of coal last year you do not need to declare the amount of coal you have on hand April 1, 1945.

3. If you purchased from more than one dealer, you must file a declaration with each one.

4. Iowa, Illinois, Indiana, Oklahoma, Western Kentucky and stoker coal are not rationed at the present time, so if you get your orders in NOW and we have the coal to deliver, you can get 100% of your last years consumption. All other coal is rationed to 80%.

5. No coal can be delivered until your declaration form has been filled out and filed with your dealer or dealers. AND, they must be filed before May 15 if you are to receive fuel this year.

50 Years Ago

April 1975

Grandma Anna Rosenbeck celebrated her 91st birthday Tuesday at her home in Guthrie Center. Born in Shelby County April 15, 1884, she lived 52 years in the Wichita community. Of Danish decent, she is known for her cook-

ing and card playing abilities. In addition, she does much "fancy" work and a tablecloth that adorned her birthday table is a product of her handiwork. Mrs Rosenbeck lives with her son-in-law and daughter, Mr and Mrs Robert Duke. John Rosenbeck of Bayard is her only other living offspring. Another son, Ben is deceased. There are four grandsons, 11 great grandchildren and four great great grandchildren. She had guests all-day and late into the evening Tuesday.

Work has started on the new \$650,000 addition to the Yale Farmers Cooperative elevator. Included in the expansion will be concrete silos that will hold a quarter of a million bushels of corn. In addition, a 2,000 bushel per hour dryer will be attached to the new facility. This new dryer will be fired by fuel oil and natural gas simultaneously and will be the first of its kind in this area. By using a double wide drive that will allow two trucks to unload at the same time, the Yale Co-Op will be able to take in 15,000 bushels per hour. This new facility will accommodate the new 50 car grain trains and a trainload of grain can be loaded in eight hours. According to Roger Koppen,

manager, 3,500 bushels can be loaded out in four minutes. Quad States Construction Company of Des Moines is building the elevator and Ken Bradtney of Des Moines will install the dryer. Target date for the completion of the entire facility is September 15, 1975. It is designed so that additions can be built later.

Two more Guthrie County hunters have received deer certificates and shoulder patches from the Iowa Conservation Commission for bagging trophy white-tail bucks.

Dennis H and Dalton H Hoover both of Guthrie Center, won trophies for deer they shot on December 7, 1974. The nontypical deer bagged with a shotgun by Dennis score 173 3/8. Dalton got a typical one with his shotgun. It's score was 158 1/2.
