The Guthrie Center City Council met November 24th, 2025 at 6:30 pm with Mayor Mike Herbert presiding. Council members Garold Thomas, Carolyn Masters, Fidel Hernandez & Ian Steensen were present. Chuck Cleveland was in attendance via phone.

Motion by Steensen, second by Cleveland to approve the consent agenda consisting of minutes from 11/10/25. Alcohol permit renewals: none. Building/Fence Permits: none. Vote: Ayes. All. Motion carried.

Cory Campbell, GCFD Fire Chief gave a presentation on the LOSAP program (Length of Service Awards Program). He explained it was passed earlier this year by the State as a way to encourage younger people to volunteer for their local fire departments. In short, it is a vested 401k type of program that the State will match the investment funds that the fiscal agent commits to the program. He stated that the GCFD Officers have come up with a points system for members to qualify for the LOSAP program & they will monitor those that qualify each year. For those that meet all of the requirements, the GCFD is asking for \$167/year per member. The maximum commitment by the City would

Mayor Thornberry opened the council meeting at 5:30 p.m. and called Roll. Council members present were Roger Dorr, Brian Dorsett, Tom Flanery, and Blake Michelsen. Mark Sheeder was absent. Staff attending were Doug Long-Electrical Superintendent and Lisa Grossman-City Administrator. The meeting was accessible electronically thru GoToMeeting as allowed by Section 21.8 of the Iowa Code.

A. Michelsen made a motion to open the public hearing on the proposed expansion of the Central Panora Urban Renewal Area, seconded by Dorsett. With the roll being called, the motion carried unanimously. Mayor Thornberry asked if any comments had been submitted. Administrator Grossman replied there were none. Hearing no other comments, Mayor Thornberry asked for a motion to close the hearing. Flanery made that motion, seconded by Michelsen. With the roll being called, the motion carried unanimously.

B. Resolution 25-41 was then considered, to Declare Necessity and Establish an Urban Renewal Area, Pursuant to Section 403.4 of the Code of Iowa and Approve Urban Renewal Plan Amendment for the Central Panora Urban Renewal Area. Dorr made a motion to approve the resolution, seconded by Michelsen. With the roll being called, the resolution carried unanimously.

C. Resolution 25-42 was also discussed, Authorizing Internal Advances for Funding of Urban Renewal Projects. Dorsett made a motion to approve, seconded by Flanery. With the roll being called, the resolution carried unanimously.

D. An amendment to the Urban Revitalization Plan was reviewed. Resolution 25-43 was then considered, providing for Notice of Hearing on Proposed Amendment to the Revitalization Plan for the Panora Urban Revitalization Area. Flanery made a motion to approve, seconded by Michelsen. With the roll being called, the resolution carried unanimously.

E. Council Member Michelsen then introduced the second reading of an ordinance entitled "Ordinance No. 358. An Ordinance adopting the 2025 City of Panora Code of Ordinances."

It was moved by Council Member Dorsett and seconded by Council Member Dorr that the Ordinance be now received, placed on file, and read by the City Clerk, the Mayor put the question on the motion and the roll being called, the following named Council Members voted:

Clerk Arrasmith shared that the new downtown holiday lights were now hung on the light poles. She encourages everyone to take a drive at night to see if they can name what Holiday movie each Character on display is from. She has received some very nice feedback on the updated lights & hopes everyone enjoys the new display.

Arrasmith stated that the new software conversion is in full swing. They will also have a new payment portal option available in December for people to utilize. She also stated at the last meeting in December (22nd), she plans on swearing in all newly elected members.

L. The minutes for the most recent Planning and Zoning Commission meeting were reviewed in regards to sidewalk sales in the Business Commercial and Historic Business Commercial Districts.
