4th Annual All-State Choir Camp at Iowa Lakes showcases student talent

with a free public concert on August 17 at the Janice K. Lund Performing Arts Center, where campers showcased the skills they developed in performing selections from the All-State repertoire.

Cherokee students included sophomores Lily Bumann and Carter Hofer, and senior Abby Glassmaker.


