Aurelia awarded Iowa DNR Trees for Kids Grant to Plant 10 new trees

AURELIA, IA - The City of Aurelia has been awarded a Trees for Kids grant through the Iowa Department of Natural Resources to plant 10 new trees within the city's right-of-way. The grant provides up to \$2,500 to purchase trees and mulch, with the goal of enhancing public spaces and engaging local youth in hands-on environmental stewardship.

Prior to applying for the grant, Aurelia's Hometown Pride Committee reached out to residents through Facebook, flyers, and press releases to gauge interest in trees along the rightof-way in front of their homes. Ten properties were identified as eligible, many of which had lost trees due to the 2021 tornado, the emerald ash borer, or have other needs for replanting. As part of the Trees for Kids program, youth are required to participate in the planting pro-

cess. In Aurelia, the Alta-Aurelia Key Club is partnering with the Hometown Pride Committee to plant the trees. The public is invited to join the planting event on Tuesday, September 30 at 4:00 p.m. at the Aurelia Community Center. This project is another example of how Aurelia Hometown Pride works to improve our
